HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 61

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING TARIK
2	ROBINSON-O'HAGAN FOR WINNING THE NATIONAL TITLE IN SHOT PUT AT THE
3	NCAA DIVISION I INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS AS WELL AS
4	FOR HIS NUMEROUS OTHER SUCCESSES.
5	WHEREAS, Tarik Robinson-O'Hagan, an athlete at the University
6	of Mississippi, reigned supreme at the NCAA Division I Indoor
7	Track and Field Championships at The Track at New Balance in

- 8 Boston, Massachusetts, when he won the national title in the shot
- 9 put at a massive personal best of 69 feet, 0.75 inches, making him
- 10 the first Ole Miss Rebel to ever win a men's shot put title and
- 11 the first underclassman nationally to win the men's shot indoors
- 12 since 2014; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the son of Keila and Dwayne O'Hagan, Tarik
- 14 Robinson-O'Hagan grew up in Woonsocket, Rhode Island, where he
- 15 attended Woonsocket High School, where he stood out not only as a
- 16 talented multi-sport athlete, but as one of the best all-around
- 17 boys shot put throwers in United States history; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Robinson-O'Hagan has won two national titles, two
- 19 U.S. U20 titles, and one Junior Olympics title, and on the

- 20 international stage, he won the 2022 World U20 gold medal in the
- 21 shot put, and in the all-time United States boys record books, he
- 22 ranks number 4 in the shot put, as well as number 3 in the 6kg
- 23 hammer and number 7 in the 12-pound hammer; and
- 24 WHEREAS, in less than two years, Robinson-O'Hagan has already
- 25 established himself as one of the best shot put throwers in Ole
- 26 Miss history and one of the most dynamic men's throwers nationally
- 27 in recent memory, as he already owns an NCAA title in addition to
- 28 six NCAA qualifying berths, six All-America honors, 21 NCAA
- 29 points, three SEC titles and 44 SEC points; and
- 30 WHEREAS, additionally, Robinson-O'Hagan also already owns
- 31 four Ole Miss records, with his indoor weight throw record from
- 32 2023 also standing as the collegiate freshman record at 77 feet, 6
- 33 inches; and
- 34 WHEREAS, his NCAA victory was just the second ever by an Ole
- 35 Miss men's field athlete indoors, alongside Olympian Savante'
- 36 Stringfellow's long jump win in 2001, and earlier in the season,
- 37 Robinson-O'Hagan became the first in SEC history to sweep the
- 38 men's shot put and weight throw at the conference meet, and he
- 39 ended his sophomore campaign already ranked third in collegiate
- 40 history in combined shot put/weight throw distance; and
- 41 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 42 and honor fine Mississippi student-athletes, especially those such
- 43 as Tarik Robinson-O'Hagan, whose extraordinary talent, athleticism

- 44 and strength has brought honor to his community, to the University
- 45 of Mississippi and to the State of Mississippi:
- 46 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 47 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 48 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate Tarik
- 49 Robinson-O'Hagan for winning the national title in shot put at the
- 50 NCAA Division I Indoor Track and Field Championships as well as
- 51 for his numerous other successes, and extend our best wishes for
- 52 continued success in all his future endeavors.
