HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 17

1 A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING TEXAS GOVERNOR GREG ABBOTT IN HIS 2 EFFORTS TO RESTORE THE SOVEREIGNTY OF TEXAS AND THE INTEGRITY OF 3 THE MEXICAN BORDER BY TRANSPORTING ILLEGAL NONCITIZENS ACROSS THE TEXAS BORDER WHERE THEY ILLEGALLY CROSSED. 5 WHEREAS, Mississippi stands in support of Governor Abbott's efforts to restore the sovereignty of Texas and the integrity of 6 7 the Mexican border transporting, by any means available, an 8 increasing number of undocumented illegal noncitizens across the 9 same Texas border they illegally crossed; and 10 WHEREAS, allied forces comprised of troops from the United States, United Kingdom, and Canada conducted an invasion named 11 12 D-Day, June 6, 1944, with a combined force of approximately 13 156,000; and 14 WHEREAS, the State of Texas has been invaded at the D-Day rate every month for the past 18 months; and 15 WHEREAS, Governor Abbott recently cited a study which 16 17 estimated that a recent court ruling allowing the Biden Administration to end the "remain in Mexico policy" could increase 18

the number of illegals entering Texas to 18,000 noncitizens daily,

20 which would constitute an increase to one D-Day invasion every

- 22 WHEREAS, the health, safety, and welfare of Texans are under
- 23 an imminent threat of disaster from the unprecedented levels of
- 24 illegal immigration, human trafficking, and drug smuggling coming
- 25 across the United States border from Mexico; and
- 26 WHEREAS, the sophisticated human smuggling and drug
- 27 trafficking organizations that facilitate these criminal acts are
- 28 spearheaded by violent international drug cartels that have
- 29 operational control over our unsecured United States-Mexico
- 30 border; and
- 31 WHEREAS, their stated mission requires Federal Border Patrol
- 32 Agents to "safeguard the American people" and to deny "illegal
- 33 entry along the border between ports of entry" to any and all
- 34 "undocumented noncitizens"; and
- 35 WHEREAS, The Department of Homeland Security has ordered
- 36 their trained and dedicated Border agents to process into the
- 37 United States an unlimited number of illegal noncitizens with
- 38 complete disregard for their own stated mission; and
- 39 WHEREAS, this invasion constitutes a violation of the
- 40 Guarantee Clause, Article IV, Section 4 of the U.S. Constitution,
- 41 as it relates to the federal Government protecting any state
- 42 against invasion; and
- 43 WHEREAS, the Founders ratified the U.S. Constitution to
- 44 include a remedy for each sovereign state if the federal

- 47 WHEREAS, this constitutional authority provided by Article I,
- Section 10, Clause 3, to repel the invasion is the legal solution 48
- 49 available to Governor Abbott; and
- 50 WHEREAS, on September 21, 2022, the Governor of Texas has
- identified certain cartels as terrorist organizations and has 51
- called upon the Biden Administration to create certain federal 52
- 53 terrorist designations for these cartels which have not occurred;
- 54 and
- 55 WHEREAS, the Governor of Texas has also directed the Texas
- 56 Department of Public Safety and other law enforcement agencies to
- 57 identify Texas gangs that support Mexican drug cartels; and
- 58 WHEREAS, multiple counties have so boldly declared an
- invasion because the health, safety, and welfare of their 59
- residents are under an imminent threat of disaster from the 60
- 61 unprecedented levels of illegal immigration, human trafficking,
- and drug smuggling coming across the United States border from 62
- 63 Mexico; and
- 64 WHEREAS, we support Governor Abbott's declaration that Texas
- 65 is being invaded; and
- 66 WHEREAS, we also agree that Governor Abbott should organize
- 67 the appropriate assets of Texas to repel this growing lawless
- 68 invasion; and

69	WHEREAS, Governor Abbott should transport, by any means
70	available, an increasing number of undocumented illegal
71	noncitizens across the same border they illegally crossed; and
72	WHEREAS, we believe that Governor Abbott's actions must be
73	implemented in order to extinguish the worldwide incentive for
74	millions of undocumented noncitizens to continue to gain illegal
75	access to the United States via Texas; and
76	WHEREAS, it is most appropriate to support our other state's
77	efforts to maintain its border and sovereignty:
78	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
79	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we support
80	Governor Abbott's efforts to restore the sovereignty of Texas and
81	the integrity of the Mexican border.
82	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we fully stand in support of our
83	brothers and sisters in the State of Texas in their struggle on
84	the front lines of this invasion.
85	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
