1	A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING MRS. NITA P. MARTIN
2	UPON BEING NAMED THE FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN CHIEF EXECUTIVE
3	OFFICER OF CENTRAL MISSISSIPPI REALTORS AND FOR HER OVERALL
4	CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE REAL ESTATE INDUSTRY.
5	WHEREAS, Mrs. Nita P. Martin is being honored for her
c	higtorical and impactful convice as the first African American t

- historical and impactful service as the first African American to
- 7 serve, from March 2022 to October 2023, as Chief Executive Officer
- (CEO) of Central Mississippi Realtors as well as for her overall 8
- 9 effective service in the real estate industry; and
- 10 WHEREAS, as one who knows the importance of earning an
- 11 education, Mrs. Martin earned a bachelor of arts in mass
- 12 communication and journalism from the University of Southern
- Mississippi (USM) as well as a master of business administration 13
- 14 from South University in Austin, Texas; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mrs. Martin, a proud native of Jackson, Mississippi,
- who is a licensed realtor, realtor association certified executive 16
- 17 and a fervent advocate for homeownership, began her career in 2006
- by selflessly serving as a Homeownership Counselor, certified by 18
- 19 the National Foundation for Credit Counseling, NeighborWorks

- 21 (HUD); and
- 22 WHEREAS, due to Mrs. Martin's zealous role in helping to
- 23 prevent foreclosures during the "Great Recession", she was awarded
- 24 the "Commitment to Excellent Award" in 2010 by the president of
- 25 Consumer Credit Counseling Services; and
- 26 WHEREAS, after Mrs. Martin's service in homeownership
- 27 counseling, which positively changed the lives of those she
- 28 served, she served as the Housing, Training & Technical Assistance
- 29 Specialist for USM's Institute for Disabilities Studies Home of
- 30 Your Own (HOYO) Program from 2010 through 2014; and
- 31 WHEREAS, during Mrs. Martin's service with HOYO, she made
- 32 vast contributions such as providing pre-purchase homebuyer
- 33 education to hundreds of individuals, and she secured \$500,000 in
- 34 HUD deferred loans and direct subsidies for mortgage financing;
- 35 and
- 36 WHEREAS, notably, the HOYO Program, during Mrs. Martin's
- 37 tenure, was awarded the "Best Homebuyer Program in the State" by
- 38 Governor Haley Barbour for three consecutive years, thus
- 39 establishing her rich legacy as a trusted and renowned housing
- 40 professional throughout the State of Mississippi; and
- 41 WHEREAS, in 2013, Mrs. Martin became a member of the FDIC's
- 42 Delta Alliance for Economic Inclusion, and staying true to her
- 43 calling, she focused on improving the economic well-being of the
- 44 unbanked and underserved; and

45	WHEREAS, Mrs. Martin, from 2014 through 2018, served as
46	Central Mississippi Realtors' Communications and Political Affairs
47	Director, and in this role, she ghost authored more than 150 real
48	estate columns that were published by the Clarion Ledger, and she
49	conducted policy research that helped lead to the repeal of HOA
50	transfer fees; and
51	WHEREAS, from 2018-2019, Mrs. Martin took her talents to
52	Texas, where she served as Government Affairs Director of Advocacy
53	for the San Antonio Board of Realtors and was appointed to the
54	Mayor's Housing Policy Task Force and the Texas Realtors Political
55	Involvement Committee, and she even wrote a grant
56	that funded the association's first Opportunity Zone Conference,
57	which speaks to her forward thinking; and
58	WHEREAS, Mrs. Martin, from 2019-2021, served as Director of
59	Government Affairs for the Orlando Regional Realtor Association,
60	where she launched political affairs and legislative advocacy for
61	the nation's seventh largest realtor association, and she
62	coordinated donations that totaled \$1.8 million for the Realtor
63	Political Action Committee (RPAC) and expended \$1,000,000 through
64	Realtor Party campaign services; and
65	WHEREAS, in 2022, after making monumental contributions in
66	Texas and Florida, Mrs. Martin returned home to her native
67	Mississippi, where she continued her rich legacy of service and
68	was appointed as CEO of Central Mississippi Realtors, where, under

her leadership, she commenced many innovative community outreach

- 70 programs such as Realtor Career Day and Power Hour Forums, just to
- 71 name a few, and she activated the Realtors Party Campaign Services
- 72 Program thus expanding the realtors brand in the Jackson metro
- 73 area; and
- 74 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 75 recognize an exceptional leader in the real estate industry such
- 76 as Mrs. Nita P. Martin whose passionate advocacy for the industry,
- 77 affordable and workforce housing, fair housing and civic
- 78 engagement stands as a role model for not only realtors in the
- 79 Magnolia State but to realtors across this great nation:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 81 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 82 commend Mrs. Nita P. Martin upon her service as the first

- 84 for her overall service within the real estate industry and wish
- 85 her continued success in all her future endeavors.
