HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 35

1 A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE EXCELLENCE OF MISSISSIPPI TRIO 2 IN OBSERVANCE OF NATIONAL TRIO DAY ON SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2024 3 AND DECLARING WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 2024, AS MISSISSIPPI TRIO DAY AT THE STATE CAPITOL. WHEREAS, TRIO is the first set of federal programs to address 5 the serious social, economic and cultural barriers to higher 6 7 education in the United States; and WHEREAS, today, more than 800,000 students in nearly 3,000 8 9 programs at host institutions, both urban and rural, make higher 10 education a reality for students who are often the first members of their family to enroll in and graduate from college; and 11 12 WHEREAS, on February 24, 1986, Congress adopted House Concurrent Resolution 278, which declared and designed February 13 28, 1986, as "National TRIO Day," and that the achievements of the 14 TRIO programs should be recognized; and 15 WHEREAS, TRIO emerged from an understanding that low-income, 16 17 first-generation students need more than financial aid to overcome the systematic obstacles in the way of their acquiring a college 18

degree; and

20	WHEREAS, National TRIO Day is meant to focus the nation's
21	"attention on the needs of disadvantaged young people and adults
22	aspiring to improve their lives if they are to become contributing
23	citizens of the country, and to the talent which will be wasted if
24	that investment is not made"; and
25	WHEREAS, by recognizing the untapped talent and potential of
26	low-income, first-generation Americans, with diverse racial and
27	economic backgrounds, TRIO programs open the doors to educational
28	access and opportunity for all every day; and
29	WHEREAS, On Wednesday, February 21, 2024, the Mississippi
30	Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel (MAEOPP)
31	will converge on the Mississippi State Capitol with over 150 TRIO
32	participants and staff in celebration of TRIO Day, to share the
33	successes of its programs with legislators, participate in tours
34	of the Capitol and to take photos with legislators from their
35	legislative districts; and
36	WHEREAS, the celebration of National TRIO Day is an
37	opportunity to recognize the needs of disadvantaged young people
38	and adults who are working to improve their lives and the lives of
39	those in their communities, and the chance to honor their hard
40	work and renew our commitment to investing in those disadvantaged
41	communities; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi hosts 56 TRIO projects which serve more

than 10,700 participants, with a total financial commitment of

- 44 more than \$18,000,000 from the United States Department of
- 45 Education; and
- WHEREAS, on the 38th anniversary of National TRIO Day we are
- 47 compelled to proclaim our commitment to educational equity,
- 48 access and opportunity for all regardless of racial or economic
- 49 background, and highlight the achievements of the programs and
- 50 beneficiaries of those programs in communities across the State of
- 51 Mississippi; and
- 52 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 53 acknowledge the outstanding commitment of such prolific
- 54 organizations as TRIO and the litany of innovative programs it
- 55 facilitates throughout the State of Mississippi and the nation to
- 56 promote postsecondary education accessibility:
- 57 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 58 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 59 declare February 21, 2024, as Mississippi TRIO Day at the Capitol
- 60 in advance of the observance of National Trio Day on February 25,
- 61 2024, and encourage all citizens to observe its recognition, and
- 62 to celebrate the life-changing programs it administers as sources
- of educational access and opportunity for low-income,
- 64 first-generation students.
- 65 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
- 66 furnished to the president of the Mississippi Association of
- 67 Educational Opportunity Program on behalf of the association, and
- 68 to the members of the Capitol Press Corps.
