- WHEREAS, founded in 1866 by the Freedman's Aid Society of the
- 5 Methodist Episcopal Church, who opened a school in Asbury
- 6 Methodist Episcopal Church, accepting adults of all ages, as well
- 7 as children, for instruction in elementary subjects, Rust College
- 8 is the second-oldest private college in the state, the oldest of
- 9 11 historically black colleges and universities (HBCU) associated
- 10 with The United Methodist Church, and is one of ten historically
- 11 HBCUs founded before 1868 that are still operating; and
- 12 WHEREAS, chartered in 1870, initially as Shaw University in
- 13 honor of benefactor, Reverend S.O. Shaw, the name was changed in
- 14 1892 to Rust University in tribute to Richard S. Rust to avoid
- 15 confusion with another Shaw University in North Carolina, and
- 16 eventually the institution's official nomenclature became Rust
- 17 College in 1915; and

18	WHEREAS, situated on the expanse of approximately 126 acres				
19	in Holly Springs, Marshall County, Mississippi, Rust graduated its				
20	first two students in 1878, and has since established and				
21	maintained five divisions of study with associate's and bachelor's				
22	degree programs in 16 areas of study within the Division of				
23	Education, Division of Humanities, Division of Science and				
24	Mathematics, Division of Social Sciences and the Division of				
25	Business; and				
26	WHEREAS, currently progressing forward with dynamic momentum				
27	under the leadership of interim president, Dr. Robert M. Dixon,				
28	whose aspirations and ambitions for excellence chronicles that of				
29	the twelve individuals who have served as president of the				
30	college, Rust remains committed to its mission to "equip and				
31	inspire students for excellence and service in their communities				
32	and throughout the world," never losing sight of its vision which				
33	"reflects an institution of learning inside and outside of the				
34	classroom" in an "environment that nurtures academic and personal				
35	development"; and				
36	WHEREAS, with an enduring legacy of superior academic and				
37	civic distinction that was birthed at the college's founding, Rust				
38	boasts a treasure trove of notable alumni, who have made				
39	remarkable contributions to society as athletic, civic, literary,

- 49 Anita Ward, disco singer; Ida B. Wells, newspaper editor, activist
- 50 and cofounder of the NAACP; Willie Mitchell, record executive,
- 51 musician and producer; and Susie Revels Cayton, activist,
- 52 journalist and editor; and
- 53 WHEREAS, endowed with a rich history of achievement, the
- 54 foundational principles upon which Rust College was founded
- 55 continue to serve as the sustaining driving force and catalyst for
- 56 innovation, propelling the pioneering scholastic advancement of
- 57 current and prospective students, and the banner upon which alumni
- 58 proudly proclaim the allegiance to their alma mater; and
- 59 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 60 recognize and commend scholastic brilliance as exemplified by
- 61 institutions of higher learning, such as Rust College, which
- 62 serves as an oasis of educational distinction, valor and
- 63 camaraderie:
