31 WHEREAS, an education activist and advocate, who currently 32 serves as an educational consultant to new teachers and 33 administrators seeking certification and licensure, former 34 National President Butler-McIntyre's record of service, 35 achievement and accomplishments have been recognized by numerous professional, religious, civic and educational organizations 36 37 around the world, which have included: the bestowing of an 38 honorary doctorate degree in divinity from Christian Bible College 39 of Louisiana and an honorary doctorate of Humane Letters from 40 Dillard University; recipient of more than ten other honors from 41 various universities; being named Bests Female Alumnus of an HBCU 42 by HBCU Digest; inclusion in Who's Who in American Education; 43 honored by and featured in *Essence* magazine; induction in the
