SENATE BILL NO. 2047

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CLARIFY THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATUTORY PROHIBITION AGAINST THE 3 ALTERATION OF HISTORICAL MONUMENTS AND MEMORIALS LOCATED ON PUBLIC 4 PROPERTY; TO PROHIBIT THE RENAMING OR REDEDICATION OF CERTAIN 5 STATUES, MONUMENTS, SCHOOLS, STREETS, PARKS OR SIMILAR STRUCTURES 6 NAMED IN HONOR OF CERTAIN MILITARY UNITS, FIGURES OR EVENTS; TO 7 PROVIDE CRIMINAL SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATION OF THIS STATUTE; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS SECTION SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE "MISSISSIPPI 8 HERITAGE PROTECTION ACT"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

11 SECTION 1. Section 55-15-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

12 amended as follows:

13 55-15-81. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited 14 as the "Mississippi Heritage Protection Act."

15 (2) None of the following items, structures or areas may be

16 relocated, removed, disturbed, altered, renamed * * * .

17 rededicated, defaced or otherwise disturbed: any American

18 Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican-American War, War Between

19 the States, Spanish-American War, World War I, World War II,

20 Korean * * * Conflict, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War I (Operation

21 Desert Shield/Desert Storm), * * * Persian Gulf War II (Operation

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22 Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan) or Native 23 American wars' statues, monuments, memorials or nameplates (plaques), which have been erected, named or dedicated in honor of 24 the foregoing historical wars or conflicts, and are located on 25 26 public property of the state or any of its political 27 subdivisions, * * * including local, municipal * * *, county, school district or public university-owned public areas * * *. 28 29 (3) No statue, monument, memorial, cemetery headstone, 30 nameplate (plaque), school, street, bridge, building, park, 31 preserve, reserve, historic flag display or other public * * * 32 item, structure or *** * *** area of the state or any of its political subdivisions, * * * including municipal * * *, county, school 33 34 district or public university-owned public * * * area, which * * * has been dedicated in memory of, or named for, any historical 35 36 military figure, historical military event, military organization 37 or military unit associated with the wars and conflicts listed in 38 subsection (2) of this section and located on public property, may be renamed, rededicated, relocated, removed, altered or otherwise 39 40 disturbed.

(***<u>4</u>) No person may prevent the public body responsible for maintaining any of the items, structures or areas described above from taking proper measures and exercising proper means for the protection, preservation, care, repair or restoration of those items, structures or areas. The governing body may move the memorial to * * * <u>another public</u> location if it is determined that

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50 (* * *5) This section shall apply to items, structures or 51 areas described in subsections (2) and (3) of this section in 52 existence before July 1, 2024, and those lawfully erected, named 53 or dedicated on or after July 1, 2024. This section shall not 54 apply to items, structures or areas located on property owned or 55 acquired by the Mississippi Transportation Commission which may 56 interfere with the construction, maintenance or operation of 57 public transportation facilities.

58 (6) Any person violating the provisions of subsection (2), 59 (3) or (4) of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 60 punishable, upon conviction thereof, by a fine not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or by imprisonment not exceeding 61 62 six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. In cases 63 where public property is damaged or defaced, the offense shall be 64 punishable by imprisonment not exceeding one (1) year, and the 65 person shall be liable for repair of the public property. In the 66 event the violation of this section is made by a public board, 67 commission or other body, each member of that board, commission or 68 body shall be individually liable to prosecution under this 69 section. 70 The provisions of this section may be amended or (7) 71 repealed only upon passage of an act that has received a

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72 two-thirds (2/3) vote on final passage in each house of the

73 Legislature.

74 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

75 and after July 1, 2024.

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
