- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-9-79, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
 DELETE THE PROVISION THAT REQUIRES PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL COUNSELORS
 TO ABIDE BY THE AMERICAN SCHOOL COUNSELOR ASSOCIATION CODE OF
 ETHICS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

 SECTION 1. Section 37-9-79, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 37-9-79. (1) Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, the 9 assignment of K-12 Professional School Counselors to the 10 particular schools within the district shall be at the discretion
- of the local school board with the following restrictions:

 (a) No individual shall be employed as a professional

- 15 appropriate certification as determined by the Commission of
