SENATE BILL NO. 2169

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-21-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO

PROVIDE THAT NO SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL REDUCE THE LOCAL SUPPLEMENT OR PAY AN INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANT TEACHER LESS THAN THE STATE MINIMUM SALARY IN A YEAR IN WHICH THE STATE MINIMUM SALARY IS INCREASED; 5 TO PROVIDE FOR A REDUCTION IN FUNDS FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT VIOLATE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION; TO PROVIDE THAT NO SCHOOL 7 DISTRICT SHALL PAY ANY ASSISTANT TEACHER LESS THAN THE STATE 8 MINIMUM SALARY UNLESS DONE SO BY A PRO RATA DAILY AMOUNT WHERE 9 THERE HAS BEEN A REDUCTION IN ADEOUATE EDUCATION PROGRAM 10 ALLOCATIONS FOR SUCH DISTRICT IN SUCH YEAR OR WHERE THERE HAS BEEN 11 A REDUCTION IN THE AMOUNT OF FEDERAL FUNDS TO SUCH DISTRICT FROM 12 THE PREVIOUS YEAR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 14 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-21-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 15 amended as follows: 16 37-21-7. (1) This section shall be referred to as the 17 "Mississippi Elementary Schools Assistant Teacher Program," the 18 purpose of which shall be to provide an early childhood education program that assists in the instruction of basic skills. The 19 State Board of Education is authorized, empowered and directed to 20 21 implement a statewide system of assistant teachers in kindergarten 22 classes and in the first, second and third grades. The assistant

- 23 teacher shall assist pupils in actual instruction under the strict
- 24 supervision of a licensed teacher.
- 25 (2) (a) Except as otherwise authorized under subsection
- 26 (7), each school district shall employ the total number of
- 27 assistant teachers funded under subsection (6) of this section.
- 28 The superintendent of each district shall assign the assistant
- 29 teachers to the kindergarten, first-, second- and third-grade
- 30 classes in the district in a manner that will promote the maximum
- 31 efficiency, as determined by the superintendent, in the
- 32 instruction of skills such as verbal and linguistic skills,
- 33 logical and mathematical skills, and social skills.
- 34 (b) If a licensed teacher to whom an assistant teacher
- 35 has been assigned is required to be absent from the classroom, the
- 36 assistant teacher may assume responsibility for the classroom in
- 37 lieu of a substitute teacher. However, no assistant teacher shall
- 38 assume sole responsibility of the classroom for more than three
- 39 (3) consecutive school days. Further, in no event shall any
- 40 assistant teacher be assigned to serve as a substitute teacher for
- 41 any teacher other than the licensed teacher to whom that assistant
- 42 teacher has been assigned.
- 43 (3) Assistant teachers shall have, at a minimum, a high
- 44 school diploma or a High School Equivalency Diploma equivalent,
- 45 and shall show demonstratable proficiency in reading and writing
- 46 skills. The State Department of Education shall develop a testing

- 49 (4) (a) In order to receive funding, each school district
- 50 shall:
- 51 (i) Submit a plan on the implementation of a
- 52 reading improvement program to the State Department of Education;
- 53 and
- 54 (ii) Develop a plan of educational accountability
- 55 and assessment of performance, including pretests and posttests,
- 56 for reading in Grades 1 through 6.
- 57 (b) Additionally, each school district shall:
- (i) Provide annually a mandatory preservice
- 59 orientation session, using an existing in-school service day, for
- 60 administrators and teachers on the effective use of assistant
- 61 teachers as part of a team in the classroom setting and on the
- 62 role of assistant teachers, with emphasis on program goals;
- 63 (ii) Hold periodic workshops for administrators
- 64 and teachers on the effective use and supervision of assistant
- 65 teachers;
- 66 (iii) Provide training annually on specific
- 67 instructional skills for assistant teachers;
- 68 (iv) Annually evaluate their program in accordance
- 69 with their educational accountability and assessment of
- 70 performance plan; and

- The State Department of Education shall: (5)
- 74 (a) Develop and assist in the implementation of a 75 statewide uniform training module, subject to the availability of 76 funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, which 77 shall be used in all school districts for training administrators, 78 teachers and assistant teachers. The module shall provide for the 79 consolidated training of each assistant teacher and teacher to 80 whom the assistant teacher is assigned, working together as a 81 team, and shall require further periodic training for 82 administrators, teachers and assistant teachers regarding the role
 - Annually evaluate the program on the district and state level. Subject to the availability of funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, the department shall develop: (i) uniform evaluation reports, to be performed by the principal or assistant principal, to collect data for the annual overall program evaluation conducted by the department; or (ii) a program evaluation model that, at a minimum, addresses process evaluation; and
 - (c) Promulgate rules, regulations and such other standards deemed necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section. Noncompliance with the provisions of this section and any rules, regulations or standards adopted by the department may

In addition to other funds allotted under the Minimum 99 (6) 100 Education or Adequate Education Program, each school district 101 shall be allotted sufficient funding for the purpose of employing assistant teachers. * * * No school district shall pay any 102 103 assistant teacher less than the state minimum salary. No school 104 district shall reduce the local supplement or amount paid to an 105 individual assistant teacher by the school district below the state minimum salary contained in this section from the previous 106 107 year in a year in which the state minimum salary is increased. 108 Should any school district violate the provisions of this 109 subsection (6), such school district's funding shall be reduced by 110 twice the amount of such reduction when computing the district's 111 allocation of Mississippi Adequate Education Program funds. 112 Provided, however, that school districts are authorized to reduce 113 the state minimum salary by a pro rata daily amount (a) where 114 there has been a reduction in adequate education program 115 allocations for such district in such year, or (b) where there has 116 been a reduction in the amount of federal funds to such district 117 compared to the amount received from the previous year. Nothing 118 herein contained shall prohibit any school district from adopting 119 or continuing a program or plan whereby assistant teachers are

120	paid varying salaries according to classroom performance and other
121	similar standards.
122	For assistant teachers, the minimum annual salary shall be as
123	follows:
124	2022-2023 and Subsequent Years Minimum Salary\$17,000.00
125	In addition, for each one percent (1%) that the Sine Die
126	General Fund Revenue Estimate Growth exceeds five percent (5%) in
127	fiscal year 2006, as certified by the Legislative Budget Office to
128	the State Board of Education and subject to the specific
129	appropriation therefor by the Legislature, the State Board of
130	Education shall revise the salary scale in the appropriate year to
131	provide an additional one percent (1%) across-the-board increase
132	in the base salaries for assistant teachers. The State Board of
133	Education shall revise the salaries prescribed above for assistant
134	teachers to conform to any adjustments made in prior fiscal years
135	due to revenue growth over and above five percent (5%). The
136	assistant teachers shall not be restricted to working only in the
137	grades for which the funds were allotted, but may be assigned to
138	other classes as provided in subsection (2)(a) of this section.
139	(7) (a) As an alternative to employing assistant teachers,
140	any school district may use the allotment provided under
141	subsection (6) of this section for the purpose of employing
142	licensed teachers for kindergarten, first-, second- and
143	third-grade classes: however no school district shall be

authorized to use the allotment for assistant teachers for the

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145	purpose	of	employing	licensed	teachers	unless	the	district	has

- 146 established that the employment of licensed teachers using such
- 147 funds will reduce the teacher: student ratio in the kindergarten,
- 148 first-, second- and third-grade classes. All state funds for
- 149 assistant teachers shall be applied to reducing teacher:student
- 150 ratio in Grades K-3.
- 151 It is the intent of the Legislature that no school district
- 152 shall dismiss any assistant teacher for the purpose of using the
- 153 assistant teacher allotment to employ licensed teachers. School
- 154 districts may rely only upon normal attrition to reduce the number
- 155 of assistant teachers employed in that district.
- 156 (b) Districts meeting the highest levels of
- 157 accreditation standards, as defined by the State Board of
- 158 Education, shall be exempted from the provisions of subsection (4)
- 159 of this section.
- 160 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 161 and after July 1, 2024.
