COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2180

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-1-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO ENFORCE THE CITY OF JACKSON'S MUNICIPAL CODE WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CAPITOL COMPLEX IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT; TO DELETE THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT REQUIRES PRIOR 5 WRITTEN APPROVAL FROM THE CHIEF OF THE CAPITOL POLICE OR THE 6 COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR EVENTS WHICH 7 WILL TAKE PLACE ON ANY STREET OR SIDEWALK IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO ANY BUILDING OR PROPERTY OWNED OR OCCUPIED BY ANY OFFICIAL, 8 9 AGENCY, BOARD, COMMISSION, OFFICE OR OTHER ENTITY OF THE STATE OF 10 MISSISSIPPI, OR WHICH CAN REASONABLY BE EXPECTED TO BLOCK, IMPEDE OR OTHERWISE HINDER INGRESS THERETO AND/OR EGRESS THEREFROM; TO 11 12 AMEND SECTION 9-12-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND 13 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 15 amended as follows: 16 17 45-1-19. (1) The Department of Public Safety, through the

Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the 18

19 enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the

properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets, 20

21 sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set

22 forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's mansion, the Supreme Court

23 Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation Building

- 24 and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and any 25 property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State 26 of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically 27 under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but 28 which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public Safety would 29 be responsible for such. The Department of Public Safety shall, 30 through any person or persons appointed by the commissioner, make 31 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi 32 on the grounds of or within those properties. The Department of 33 Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the provisions of this section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through 34 35 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and prescribe such rules and 36 regulations as are necessary therefor. The powers and duties
- 40 Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of (2) State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and 41 42 the Department of Public Safety shall be authorized to enter into 43 a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the 44 security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the 45 State of Mississippi on the property of the Board of Trustees 46 located at the corner of Ridgewood Road and Lakeland Drive in the 47 City of Jackson.

related to the administration of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67,

29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95 shall remain

with the Department of Finance and Administration.

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- 48 (3) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
 49 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
 50 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
 51 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
 52 of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new
 53 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and
- of rankers market buriding located at the corner or high and
- Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County,
- 55 Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 56 Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel
- 57 at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and
- 58 responses to security system alarms.
- 59 (4) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 60 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 61 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
- 62 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- 63 of Agriculture known as the "Mississippi State Fairgrounds
- 64 Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and property.
- 65 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture
- 66 are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of
- 67 Public Safety to supply the security personnel to the Department
- 68 of Agriculture with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State
- 69 of Mississippi on this property and any and all buildings on this
- 70 property. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to charge
- 71 the Department of Agriculture a fee for security services provided
- 72 for special events at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex.

- 73 The fee charged will be commensurate with the cost associated with
- 74 the Department of Public Safety providing those services.
- 75 (5) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 76 Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department
- 77 of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with
- 78 jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi at
- 79 the Alcoholic Beverage Control facility and the Department of
- 80 Revenue main office.
- 81 (6) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall have primary
- 82 jurisdiction relative to any other state or municipal law
- 83 enforcement agency to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi
- 84 within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District
- 85 created in Section 29-5-203; such enforcement shall be its primary
- 86 function. The Department of Public Safety may, through any person
- 87 or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, make
- 88 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi
- 89 and violations of the City of Jackson's * * * ordinances * * *
- 90 which * * * occur within the boundaries of the district and within
- 91 the boundaries of the City of Jackson . As the law enforcement
- 92 agency with primary jurisdiction within the boundaries of the
- 93 Capitol Improvement District as created in Section 29-5-203, the
- 94 <u>department shall enforce</u> the City of Jackson's municipal code
- 95 within the boundaries of the district. The Department of Public
- 96 Safety may choose to present cases to either the District Attorney
- 97 or the prosecuting attorneys designated by the Attorney General

98 for prosecution of any violation of law that accrues or occurs, in 99 whole or in part, within the boundaries established by Section 100 29-5-203. The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety granted under this subsection (6) shall be concurrent with the 101 102 jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of 103 Hinds County, Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol 104 Complex Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203. At any 105 time and/or during any event necessitating the coordination of 106 and/or utilization at multiple jurisdictions, as determined by the 107 Chief of Capitol Police or the Commissioner of the Department of 108 Public Safety shall be the lead agency when the event occurs on 109 property as defined herein that is owned or leased by the state as 110 provided in subsection (1) of this section. The jurisdiction and authority of the Department of Public Safety under this subsection 111 (6) shall be in addition to any other jurisdiction and authority 112 113 provided to the department under this section or any other law. 114 The Department of Public Safety shall have (b) jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State 115 116 of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of Jackson, 117 Mississippi. The Department of Public Safety may, through any 118 person or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, 119 make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of 120 Mississippi which occurs within the boundaries of the City of 121 The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety Jackson. granted under this paragraph (b) shall not be primary and shall be 122

- 123 concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson,
- 124 Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi.
- 125 * * *
- 126 (* * *c) The Chief of the Capitol Police and/or the
- 127 Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, the Chief of the
- 128 Jackson Police Department, and the Sheriff of Hinds County shall
- 129 hold a regular meeting within the boundaries of the Capitol
- 130 Complex Improvement District to address the concerns of the
- 131 public. Each meeting shall be called by the Chief of the Capitol
- 132 Police; and the first meeting shall be called by October 15, 2023.
- 133 (7) The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter
- into a contract with any county for the county to take custody of
- 135 the misdemeanor offenders arrested under the authority granted
- 136 under this section.
- 137 (8) All accrued personal leave earned pursuant to Section
- 138 25-3-93, accrued major medical leave earned pursuant to Section
- 139 25-3-95, accrued state compensatory leave earned pursuant to
- 140 Section 25-3-92, and compensatory leave earned pursuant to the
- 141 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall transfer from the Department
- 142 of Finance and Administration to the Department of Public Safety
- 143 for all employees transferred under this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 9-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 145 amended as follows:
- 146 9-12-1. (1) (a) From and after January 1, 2024, there

147 shall be created one (1) inferior court as authorized by Article

- 148 6, Section 172 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to be 149 located within the boundaries established in Section 29-5-203 for 150 the Capitol Complex Improvement District, hereinafter referred to 151 as "CCID". The CCID inferior court shall have jurisdiction to 152 hear and determine all preliminary matters and criminal matters 153 authorized by law for municipal courts that accrue or occur, in 154 whole or in part, within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex 155 Improvement District; and shall have the same jurisdiction as 156 municipal courts to hear and determine all cases charging 157 violations of the motor vehicle and traffic laws of this state, 158 and violations of the City of Jackson's * * * ordinances or municipal code * * * that accrue or occur, in whole or in part, 159 160 within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District.
- 161 (b) Any person convicted in the CCID inferior court may
 162 be placed in the custody of the Mississippi Department of
 163 Corrections, Central Mississippi facility.
- 164 (2) The Chief Justice of the Mississippi Supreme Court shall
 165 appoint the CCID inferior court judge authorized by this section.
 166 The judge shall possess all qualifications required by law for
 167 municipal court judges. Such judge shall be a qualified elector
 168 of this state, and shall have such other qualifications as
 169 provided by law for municipal judges.
- 170 (3) The Administrative Office of Courts shall provide
 171 compensation for the CCID inferior court judge and the support
 172 staff of the judge. Such compensation shall not be in an amount

174	their	supp	ort	staff	in	the	City	of	Jackson.			

- (4) All fines, penalties, fees and costs imposed and collected by the CCID inferior court shall be deposited with the City of Jackson municipal treasurer or equivalent officer.
- 178 (5) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2027.
- 179 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 180 and after its passage.
