SENATE BILL NO. 2180

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-1-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 DELETE THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT REQUIRES PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL FROM THE CHIEF OF THE CAPITOL POLICE OR THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR EVENTS WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE ON 5 ANY STREET OR SIDEWALK IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO ANY BUILDING OR 6 PROPERTY OWNED OR OCCUPIED BY ANY OFFICIAL, AGENCY, BOARD, COMMISSION, OFFICE OR OTHER ENTITY OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, OR 7 WHICH CAN REASONABLY BE EXPECTED TO BLOCK, IMPEDE OR OTHERWISE 8 9 HINDER INGRESS THERETO AND/OR EGRESS THEREFROM; AND FOR RELATED 10 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 **SECTION 1.** Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows: 45-1-19. (1) The Department of Public Safety, through the 14 15 Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the 16 17 properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets, sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set 18 forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's mansion, the Supreme Court 19 20 Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation Building and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and any 21 22 property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State

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- 23 of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically
- 24 under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but
- 25 which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public Safety would
- 26 be responsible for such. The Department of Public Safety shall,
- 27 through any person or persons appointed by the commissioner, make
- 28 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi
- 29 on the grounds of or within those properties. The Department of
- 30 Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the provisions of this
- 31 section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through
- 32 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and prescribe such rules and
- 33 regulations as are necessary therefor. The powers and duties
- 34 related to the administration of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67,
- $35 \quad 29-5-73 \text{ through } 29-5-75, \text{ and } 29-5-81 \text{ through } 29-5-95 \text{ shall remain}$
- 36 with the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 37 (2) Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of
- 38 State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and
- 39 the Department of Public Safety shall be authorized to enter into
- 40 a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the
- 41 security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the
- 42 State of Mississippi on the property of the Board of Trustees
- 43 located at the corner of Ridgewood Road and Lakeland Drive in the
- 44 City of Jackson.
- 45 (3) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 46 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 47 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all

- 48 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- 49 of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new
- 50 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and
- 51 Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County,
- 52 Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 53 Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel
- 54 at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and
- 55 responses to security system alarms.
- 56 (4) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 57 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 58 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
- 59 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- of Agriculture known as the "Mississippi State Fairgrounds
- 61 Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and property.
- 62 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture
- 63 are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of
- 64 Public Safety to supply the security personnel to the Department
- 65 of Agriculture with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State
- of Mississippi on this property and any and all buildings on this
- 67 property. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to charge
- 68 the Department of Agriculture a fee for security services provided
- 69 for special events at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex.
- 70 The fee charged will be commensurate with the cost associated with
- 71 the Department of Public Safety providing those services.

- 72 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of 73 Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department 74 of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with
- 75 jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi at
- 76 the Alcoholic Beverage Control facility and the Department of
- 77 Revenue main office.
- 78 The Department of Public Safety shall have primary (a) 79 jurisdiction relative to any other state or municipal law 80 enforcement agency to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District 81 created in Section 29-5-203; such enforcement shall be its primary 82 83 The Department of Public Safety may, through any person function. 84 or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, make 85 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi and violations of the City of Jackson's traffic ordinances or 86 87 ordinances related to the disturbance of the public peace which 88 occurs within the boundaries of the district and within the boundaries of the City of Jackson. The Department of Public 89 90 Safety may choose to present cases to either the District Attorney 91 or the prosecuting attorneys designated by the Attorney General 92 for prosecution of any violation of law that accrues or occurs, in 93 whole or in part, within the boundaries established by Section 94 29-5-203. The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety 95 granted under this subsection (6) shall be concurrent with the

jurisdiction of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of

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- 97 Hinds County, Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol
- 98 Complex Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203. At any
- 99 time and/or during any event necessitating the coordination of
- 100 and/or utilization at multiple jurisdictions, as determined by the
- 101 Chief of Capitol Police or the Commissioner of the Department of
- 102 Public Safety shall be the lead agency when the event occurs on
- 103 property as defined herein that is owned or leased by the state as
- 104 provided in subsection (1) of this section. The jurisdiction and
- 105 authority of the Department of Public Safety under this subsection
- 106 (6) shall be in addition to any other jurisdiction and authority
- 107 provided to the department under this section or any other law.
- 108 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall have
- 109 jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State
- 110 of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of Jackson,
- 111 Mississippi. The Department of Public Safety may, through any
- 112 person or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety,
- 113 make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of
- 114 Mississippi which occurs within the boundaries of the City of
- 115 Jackson. The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety
- 116 granted under this paragraph (b) shall not be primary and shall be
- 117 concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson,
- 118 Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi.

- 120 (* * *c) The Chief of the Capitol Police and/or the
- 121 Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, the Chief of the

122	Jackson	Police	Department,	and	the	Sheriff	of	Hinds	County	shall

- 123 hold a regular meeting within the boundaries of the Capitol
- 124 Complex Improvement District to address the concerns of the
- 125 public. Each meeting shall be called by the Chief of the Capitol
- 126 Police; and the first meeting shall be called by October 15, 2023.
- 127 (7) The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter
- 128 into a contract with any county for the county to take custody of
- 129 the misdemeanor offenders arrested under the authority granted
- 130 under this section.
- 131 (8) All accrued personal leave earned pursuant to Section
- 132 25-3-93, accrued major medical leave earned pursuant to Section
- 133 25-3-95, accrued state compensatory leave earned pursuant to
- 134 Section 25-3-92, and compensatory leave earned pursuant to the
- 135 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall transfer from the Department
- 136 of Finance and Administration to the Department of Public Safety
- 137 for all employees transferred under this section.
- 138 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 139 and after its passage.
