SENATE BILL NO. 2196 (As Passed the Senate)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-7-75, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE AN ENHANCED SENTENCE OF IMPRISONMENT FOR A PERSON WHO 3 MAKES A TERRORISTIC THREAT AGAINST AN AIRPORT; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 97-7-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 97-7-75. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited 8 9 as the "Mississippi Terroristic Threats Law." 10 (2) (a) A person commits the offense of making a terroristic threat when the person makes a threat to commit a 11 12 crime of violence or a threat to cause bodily injury to another person if the threat does in fact cause a reasonable expectation 13 or reasonable fear of the imminent commission of an offense and 14 if, in making the threat, the person has the intent to: 15 (i) Intimidate or coerce a civilian population or 16 17 segment of a civilian population; or 18 (ii) Influence or affect, by intimidation or 19 coercion, the policy or conduct of a unit of government, G1/2S. 20 educational institution, business or segment of the civilian 21 population.

(b) It is not a defense to a prosecution under this section that, at the time the defendant made the terroristic threat, the defendant did not have the intent or capability to actually commit the specified offense, nor is it a defense that the threat was not made to a person who was a subject or intended victim of the threatened act.

(3) (a) A person convicted of the offense of making a
terroristic threat is guilty of a felony punishable by
imprisonment in the custody of the Mississippi Department of
Corrections for not more than ten (10) years.

32 (b) A person convicted of the offense of making a 33 terroristic threat where the threat is made against an airport as 34 defined by Section 61-1-3 shall be punished by imprisonment for a 35 term of not less than five (5) years in the custody of the 36 Mississippi Department of Corrections in addition to the term of 37 imprisonment imposed under paragraph (a) of this subsection. 38 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

39 and after July 1, 2024.
