- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 4 **SECTION 1.** (1) This act may be cited as the "Mississippi
- 5 National Security in Public Purchasing Act."
- 6 (2) For the purposes of this section, the following words
- 7 and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in this section,
- 8 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 (a) "Agency" means any state board, commission,
- 10 committee, council, university, department or unit thereof created
- 11 by the Constitution or statutes.
- 12 (b) "Political subdivision" means any body politic or
- 13 body corporate other than the state responsible for governmental
- 14 activities only in geographic areas smaller than that of the
- 15 state, including, but not limited to, any county, municipality,
- 16 school district, charter school, volunteer fire department that is
- 17 a chartered nonprofit corporation providing emergency services
- 18 under contract with a county or municipality, community hospital

- 19 as defined in Section 41-13-10, airport authority, or other
- 20 instrumentality of the state, whether or not the body or
- instrumentality has the authority to levy taxes or to sue or be 21
- 22 sued in its own name.
- 23 (C) "Technology-related" equipment means any device
- 24 capable of downloading, accessing, collecting, transferring,
- manipulating, storing, processing or transferring electronic data, 25
- 26 including but not limited to: business and personal computing
- 27 devices, including tablets and smartphones, printers, televisions,
- video cameras, servers, modems, routers, hard drives, headsets and 28
- aerial surveillance drones. 29
- "Hostile foreign nation" means any foreign nation 30 (d)
- 31 who is:
- 32 Determined by the U.S. Department of Defense (i)
- to be openly hostile to the interests of the United States; or 33
- 34 (ii) Determined by the U.S. Department of State
- 35 Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor to be in violation of
- international human rights law; or 36
- 37 (iii) One of the following countries: China,
- 38 Cuba, Iran, North Korea, Russia or Syria.
- 39 SECTION 2. It is the policy and the will of the Mississippi
- 40 Legislature that the State of Mississippi avoid any national
- security risk in the business dealings of this state and to avoid 41
- 42 all business dealings with countries that violate international
- 43 human rights laws. The Mississippi Legislature recognizes that

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- 44 the United States Congress has banned the Department of Defense
- 45 from purchasing and using drones and other components manufactured
- 46 in China due to national security risk, and this act seeks to do
- 47 the same and more in Mississippi.
- 48 **SECTION 3.** (1) It shall be an unlawful practice for any
- 49 state agency or political subdivision to purchase with public
- 50 funds any technology-related equipment manufactured within the
- 51 borders of a hostile foreign nation or by a company headquartered
- 52 within the borders of or having significant corporate or political
- 53 ties with a hostile foreign nation.
- 54 (2) The use of any technology-based equipment owned by a
- 55 state agency or political subdivision in violation of this chapter
- 56 as of the passage of this act shall cease as of July 1, 2024. The
- 57 agency or subdivision must sell or otherwise dispose of the
- 58 equipment by January 1, 2025.
- 59 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 60 and after July 1, 2024.
