COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2311

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE CAP FOR AN ANNUAL SUPPLEMENT PAYABLE BY THE BOARD OF 3 SUPERVISORS OF ANY COUNTY TO ITS SHERIFF, AND TO CLARIFY THAT SUCH 4 SUPPLEMENT SHALL BE THE TOTAL SALARY AUTHORIZED; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9

25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections 10 (2) through (12) of this section, the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties are fixed as full compensation for their 11 12 services.

The annual salary for each sheriff shall be based upon the 13 total population of his county according to the latest federal 14 15 decennial census in the following categories and for the following 16 amounts; however, no sheriff shall be paid less than the salary 17 authorized under this section to be paid the sheriff based upon the population of the county according to the most recent federal 18 19 decennial census:

(a) For counties with a total population of more than
one hundred thousand (100,000), a salary of One Hundred Four
Thousand Dollars (\$104,000.00).

(b) For counties with a total population of more than forty-four thousand (44,000) and not more than one hundred thousand (100,000), a salary of Ninety-five Thousand Dollars (\$95,000.00).

(c) For counties with a total population of more than
thirty thousand (30,000) and not more than forty-four thousand
(44,000), a salary of Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00).

30 (d) For counties with a total population of more than 31 twelve thousand five hundred (12,500) and not more than thirty 32 thousand (30,000), a salary of Eighty-five Thousand Dollars 33 (\$85,000.00).

34 (e) For counties with a total population of not more
35 than twelve thousand five hundred (12,500), a salary of Eighty
36 Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00).

(2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County, in
its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
(\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
county for the following reasons:

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The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates (b) and maintains a community work center within the county; 47

48 (C) There is a resident circuit court judge in the 49 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;

50 There is a resident chancery court judge in the (d) 51 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;

52 The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court (e) 53 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the 54 Leflore County Courthouse;

55 The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation (f) 56 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to 57 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as 58 patients from within the county;

59 (q) The increased activity of the Child Support 60 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the 61 62 sheriff; and

63 The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in (h) 64 place in Leflore County have been placed under the direction and 65 control of the sheriff.

In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 66 (3) 67 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 68

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69 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars

70 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 71 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 72 county for the following reasons:

(a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
the county;

76 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained77 within the county at Whitfield;

(c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for
the care and treatment of persons with an intellectual disability,
is located within the county;

81 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training
82 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;

83 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained84 within the county;

85 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District, 86 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within 87 the county;

88 (g) The Jackson-Medgar Wiley Evers International89 Airport is located within the county;

90 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located 91 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff; 92 and 93 (i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to 94 the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county, 95 has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution 96 of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property 97 located in Rankin County.

98 (4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 99 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall 100 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount 101 equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

(5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), payable beginning April 1, 1997.

107 (6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 108 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall 109 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount 110 equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature 111 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this 112 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:

(a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand (100,000) more than the next most populous county;

(c) Hinds County is the third largest county in geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875) square miles;

122 (d) Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial123 districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings;

(e) There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four
(4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges
in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting
as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for
all;

(f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi are located within the county;

(g) The state's only urban university, Jackson StateUniversity, is located within the county;

(h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center,
combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and
hospital, is located within the county;

138 (i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's139 largest sports arena, is located within the county;

140 (j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including the141 Coliseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;

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(k) Hinds County has the largest criminal population in the state, such that the Hinds County Sheriff's Department operates the largest county jail system in the state, housing almost one thousand (1,000) inmates in three (3) separate detention facilities;

(1) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department handles more mental and drug and alcohol commitment cases than any other sheriff's department in the state;

(m) The Mississippi Department of Corrections maintainsa restitution center within the county;

(n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly
houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the
Hinds County jail system; and

(o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of Art and Jackson City Auditorium.

(7) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 166 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 167 correctional facility within the county.

168 In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) (8) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in 169 170 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 171 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 172 173 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 174 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 175 176 correctional facility within the county.

(9) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its
discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
(\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
county for the following reasons:

184 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
185 and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
186 the county;

(b) In 1996, additional facilities to house another one thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within the county; and

194 In addition to the salary provided in subsections (1) (10)195 through (9) of this section, the board of supervisors of any 196 county, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the 197 sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed * * * Twenty-five 198 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). The amount of the supplement shall 199 be spread on the minutes of the board. * * * In no instance shall 200 the annual supplement authorized in subsections (2) through (10) of this section exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). 201 202 The salary provided in subsection (1) of this section plus any 203 annual supplement authorized in subsections (2) through (10) of 204 this section shall be the total salary authorized for that sheriff 205 and shall not be increased or supplemented by the board of 206 supervisors for its sheriff from another source.

207 In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) (11)and the supplements authorized in subsections (2) through (10), 208 209 the board of supervisors of any county, in its discretion, may pay 210 an annual supplement in an amount not to exceed Five Thousand 211 Dollars (\$5,000.00) to the sheriff of any county in which a 212 juvenile detention center is located. The amount of the 213 supplement shall be spread on the minutes of the board. 214 In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of (12)

219 The salaries provided in this section shall be (13)(a) 220 payable monthly on the first day of each calendar month by 221 chancery clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; 222 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and 223 entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be 224 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments 225 226 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or 227 legal holiday.

228 At least Ten Dollars (\$10.00) from each fee (b) 229 collected and deposited into the county's general fund under the 230 provisions of paragraphs (a), (c) and (g) of subsection (1) of 231 Section 25-7-19 shall be used for the sheriffs' salaries 232 authorized in Section 25-3-25; as such Ten Dollar (\$10.00) amount 233 was authorized during the 2007 Regular Session in Chapter 331, 234 Laws of 2007, for the purpose of providing additional monies to the counties for sheriffs' salaries. 235

(14) (a) All sheriffs, each year, shall attend twenty (20)
hours of continuing education courses in law enforcement. Such
courses shall be approved by the Mississippi Board on Law
Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. Such education

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240 courses may be provided by an accredited law enforcement academy 241 or by the Mississippi Sheriffs' Association.

(b) The Mississippi Board on Law Enforcement Officer
Standards and Training shall reimburse each county for the
expenses incurred by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs for attendance
at any approved training programs as required by this subsection.
SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2024.
