AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-907, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DEFINE "CAREGIVER," "FAMILY MEMBER" AND "HOUSEHOLD MEMBER" FOR 2 3 THE PURPOSES OF THE BALLOT HARVESTING LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-907, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 23-15-907. (1) For purposes of this section, the following 8 9 words shall have the meanings as defined herein unless the context 10 clearly indicates otherwise: (a) "Caregiver" means an individual who provides 11 12 medical, health care assistance or other assistance to the person 13 to whom the ballot was mailed in a residence, hospital, long-term 14 care facility, nursing home, hospice facility, assisted living center, assisted living facility, assisted living home, 15 residential care institution, adult day health care facility, 16

adult foster care home or other similar facility or institution.
