SENATE BILL NO. 2504

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF AND HIS DEPUTIES IN ANY COUNTY TO USE 3 RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS AND 4 HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE COUNTY, LYING OUTSIDE THE LIMITS OF ANY 5 INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY; TO EXCLUDE ANY INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS OR 6 FOUR-LANE STATE HIGHWAYS FROM RADAR DETECTION BY SHERIFFS; TO 7 PROVIDE FOR THE NUMBER OF RADAR GUNS ELIGIBLE FOR PURCHASE BY A COUNTY BASED ON THE NUMBER OF FULLTIME DEPUTIES IN THE COUNTY; TO 8 9 PROHIBIT THE USE OF RADAR WITHIN 500 YARDS OF THE BOUNDARY LINE OF 10 A MUNICIPALITY, THE BOUNDARY LINE OF THE COUNTY AND A SPEED LIMIT 11 CHANGE; TO PROVIDE THAT CERTAIN FUNDS SHALL BE DIRECTED TO THE 12 SCHOOL DISTRICT WHERE THE CITATION WAS ISSUED TO BE USED FOR 13 SCHOOL SAFETY PURPOSES AND DRIVER'S EDUCATION PROGRAMS; AND FOR 14 RELATED PURPOSES.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

16 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

17 amended as follows:

18 63-3-519. It shall be unlawful for any person or peace 19 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 20 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 21 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 22 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 23 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a

24 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more

(b) By any college or university campus police force
within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
(2,000) students are enrolled;

32 (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any 33 municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand 34 (15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally 35 designated highways lying within the corporate limits **\* \* \***;

36 By municipal law enforcement officers upon the (d) 37 public streets of any incorporated municipality (i) where the county seat is located in the municipality and (ii) where there is 38 39 a public community college located in the municipality \* \* \*; and 40 (e) By the sheriff and deputy sheriffs of any county on any public county road or highway within the county, excluding any 41 interstate or any four-lane state highway, which is located 42 43 outside the corporate limits of any incorporated municipality. 44 Under this paragraph (e): 45 (i) Each sheriff's department with: 46 1. One (1) to ten (10) fulltime deputies 47 shall not purchase more than one (1) radar gun; 48 2. Eleven (11) to twenty-five (25) fulltime 49 deputies shall not purchase more than two (2) radar guns;

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50	3. Twenty-six (26) to fifty (50) fulltime		
51	deputies shall not purchase more than three (3) radar guns;		
52	4. Fifty-one (51) to one hundred (100)		
53	fulltime deputies shall not purchase more than four (4) radar		
54	guns; and		
55	5. More than one hundred (100) fulltime		
56	deputies shall not purchase more than five (5) radar guns.		
57	(ii) Each sheriff's department shall not use radar		
58	within five hundred (500) yards of:		
59	1. The boundary line of a municipality;		
60	2. The boundary line of the county; and		
61	3. A speed limit change; and		
62	(iii) Any funds received in association with a		
63	speeding violation detected by a sheriff or deputy sheriff through		
64	the use of radar speed detection equipment under this paragraph		
65	that would otherwise have returned to the county shall be		
66	deposited into the fund of the school district in which the		
67	citation was issued. Such funds may be used by the school		
68	<u>district for:</u>		
69	1. School safety purposes, including school		
70	resource officers; and		
71	2. Driver's education programs.		
72	The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall be immediately		
73	notified by municipal law enforcement of any road blockages or		

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74 emergencies occurring on any federally designated limited-access
75 highways lying within the corporate limits.

76 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 77 and after July 1, 2024.

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
