## SENATE BILL NO. 2576 (As Passed the Senate)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-563, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO FURTHER CLARIFY WHAT COUNTS AS VALID VOTER IDENTIFICATION; AND 2 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 **SECTION 1.** Section 23-15-563, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 23-15-563. (1) Each person who appears to vote in person at a polling place or the registrar's office shall be required to 8 9 identify himself or herself to a poll manager or the registrar by presenting current and valid photo identification before such 10 11 person shall be allowed to vote. 12 The identification required by subsection (1) of this section shall include, but not be limited to, the following: 13 14 (a) A \* \* \* valid Mississippi driver's license; 15 (b) A \* \* \* valid identification card issued by a 16 branch, department, agency or entity of the State of Mississippi;

(c) A \* \* \* valid United States passport;

- 20 department, agency or entity of the United States government, the

- 30 containing a photograph of the elector, issued by any accredited

- 35 (3) For purposes of this section valid shall mean an
- 36 official government document that establishes the voter's identity
- 37 and has no expiration date or has an issuance date not more than

- 40 polling place and does not have identification as required by this
- 41 section may vote by affidavit ballot. The affidavit ballot shall

- 44 (b) An elector who has a religious objection to being
- 45 photographed may vote by affidavit ballot, and the elector, within
- 46 five (5) days after the election, shall execute an affidavit in
- 47 the registrar's office affirming that the exemption applies.

- and shall be reported to the Secretary of State and the Attorney
