## SENATE BILL NO. 2632

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF AND HIS DEPUTIES IN ANY COUNTY TO USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE COUNTY, LYING OUTSIDE THE LIMITS OF ANY 5 INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY UNTIL A CERTAIN DATE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 6 NUMBER OF RADAR GUNS ELIGIBLE FOR PURCHASE BY A COUNTY BASED ON 7 THE NUMBER OF FULL-TIME DEPUTIES IN THE COUNTY; TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF RADAR WITHIN 500 YARDS OF THE BOUNDARY LINE OF A 8 9 MUNICIPALITY, THE BOUNDARY LINE OF THE COUNTY AND A SPEED LIMIT 10 CHANGE; TO PROHIBIT SHERIFFS FROM USING RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT ON ANY INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS OR FOUR-LANE STATE HIGHWAYS; 11 12 TO PROVIDE THAT CERTAIN FUNDS SHALL BE DIRECTED TO THE SCHOOL 13 DISTRICT WHERE THE CITATION WAS ISSUED TO BE USED FOR SCHOOL SAFETY PURPOSES AND DRIVER'S EDUCATION PROGRAMS; AND FOR RELATED 14 1.5 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 16 17 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 18 19 63-3-519. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace

officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway

Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of

radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or

highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used:

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Z 4	(a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a
25	municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more
26	according to the latest or a previous federal census upon the
27	public streets of the municipality, but in no case where the
28	latest federal census population for the municipality is less than
29	one thousand five hundred (1,500);
30	(b) By any college or university campus police force
31	within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
32	(2,000) students are enrolled;
33	(c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any
34	municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand
35	(15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally
36	designated highways lying within the corporate limits * * $\star$ ;
37	(d) By municipal law enforcement officers upon the
38	public streets of any incorporated municipality (i) where the
39	county seat is located in the municipality and (ii) where there is
40	a public community college located in the municipality * * $*$ ; and
41	(e) By the sheriff and deputy sheriffs of any county on
42	any public county road or highway within the county which is
43	located outside the corporate limits of any incorporated
44	municipality until July 1, 2026. Under this paragraph (e):
45	(i) Each sheriff's department with:
46	1. One (1) to ten (10) full-time deputies
47	shall not purchase more than one (1) radar gun;

48	2. Eleven (11) to twenty-five (25) full-time
49	deputies shall not purchase more than two (2) radar guns;
50	3. Twenty-six (26) to fifty (50) full-time
51	deputies shall not purchase more than three (3) radar guns;
52	4. Fifty-one (51) to one hundred (100)
53	full-time deputies shall not purchase more than four (4) radar
54	guns; and
55	5. More than one hundred (100) full-time
56	deputies shall not purchase more than five (5) radar guns; and
57	(ii) Each sheriff's department shall not use radar
58	speed detection equipment within five hundred (500) yards of:
59	1. The boundary line of a municipality;
60	2. The boundary line of the county; and
61	3. A speed limit change; and
62	(iii) Each sheriff's department shall not use
63	radar speed detection equipment on any interstate or any four-lane
64	state highway; and
65	(iv) Any funds received in association with a
66	speeding violation detected by a sheriff or deputy sheriff through
67	the use of radar speed detection equipment under this paragraph
68	that would otherwise have returned to the county shall be
69	deposited into the fund of the school district in which the
70	citation was issued. Such funds may be used by the school
71	district for:

72	1. School safety purposes, including school
73	resource officers; and
74	2. Driver's education programs.
75	(2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall be
76	immediately notified by municipal or county law enforcement of any
77	road blockages or emergencies occurring on any federally
78	designated limited-access highways lying within the corporate $\underline{\text{or}}$
79	<pre>county limits.</pre>
80	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

81 and after July 1, 2024.
