SENATE BILL NO. 2640

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXPAND THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO NINE MEMBERS; TO REQUIRE FOUR OF SUCH MEMBERS TO MEET CERTAIN EDUCATION OR EXPERIENCE QUALIFICATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-4-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 49-4-4. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- 9 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, to be composed
- 10 of * * * nine (9) persons appointed by the Governor, with the
- 11 advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of five (5) years.
- 12 One (1) person shall be appointed from each congressional
- 13 district. The initial terms of the members shall be one (1), two
- 14 (2), three (3), four (4) and five (5) years, respectively.
- 15 Thereafter, all terms shall be for five (5) years. An appointment
- 16 to fill a vacancy which arises for reasons other than by
- 17 expiration of a term of office shall be made from the respective
- 18 congressional district for the unexpired term only. No member may

- 19 serve more than two (2) consecutive five (5) year terms on the
- 20 commission.
- 21 (2) The commission shall elect from its membership a
- 22 chairman who shall preside over meetings and a vice chairman who
- 23 shall preside in the absence of the chairman or when the chairman
- 24 shall be excused.
- 25 (3) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations
- 26 governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner
- 27 of conducting its business. Each member of the commission shall
- 28 take the oath prescribed by Section 268 of the Mississippi
- 29 Constitution, and shall enter into bond in the amount of Thirty
- 30 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to be approved by the Secretary of
- 31 State, conditioned according to law, and payable to the State of
- 32 Mississippi before assuming the duties of office. Any member who
- 33 shall not attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the
- 34 commission shall be subject to removal by a majority vote of the
- 35 commission members.
- 36 (4) The members of the commission shall receive no annual
- 37 salary but shall receive per diem compensation as authorized by
- 38 law for each day devoted to the discharge of official duties and
- 39 shall be entitled to reimbursement for all actual and necessary
- 40 expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including
- 41 mileage as authorized by law.
- 42 (5) * * * Five (5) members of the commission shall be

43 composed of persons with a demonstrated history of involvement in

- 44 at least one (1) of the matters of jurisdiction of the commission
- 45 and whose employment and activities are not in conflict. Four (4)
- 46 members of the commission shall be composed of members who either
- 47 hold a bachelor of science degree in either wildlife biology,
- 48 wildlife conservation, wildlife research, wildlife management, or
- 49 a related life sciences degree. Absent a bachelor's degree in one
- 50 (1) of the above-named fields, a member may qualify by having at
- 51 least ten (10) years experience working with a company or
- 52 companies specializing in either wildlife biology, wildlife
- 53 conservation, wildlife research or wildlife management. All of
- 54 the commissioners shall be an active outdoorsman holding a
- 55 resident hunting or fishing license in at least * * * ten (10)
- 56 years preceding appointment. A member shall not have a record of
- 57 conviction of violation of fish or game laws and regulations
- 58 within * * * ten (10) years preceding appointment or a record of
- 59 any felony conviction, or a record of more than two (2) citations
- 60 for a violation of fish or game laws within the ten (10) years
- 61 preceding appointment.
- 62 (* * *6) The commission shall have the power to adopt,
- 63 amend and repeal such regulations and rules as may be necessary
- 64 for the operation of the department.
- 65 (* * *7) The commission shall have the power and authority
- 66 to issue all licenses and permits under the jurisdiction of the
- 67 department.



- 68 (* * * $\underline{8}$) In the furtherance of its duties and
- 69 responsibilities, the commission may conduct hearings, gather
- 70 testimony and perform other functions required to carry out its
- 71 powers and duties as prescribed by statute.
- 72 (***9) The commission shall have all power for
- 73 conserving, managing and developing wildlife and fishery resources
- 74 in accordance with sound scientific principles, and in
- 75 collaboration with the agency staff of the department, except for
- 76 saltwater aquatic life and marine resources under the jurisdiction
- 77 of the Mississippi Commission on Marine Resources.
- 78 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 79 and after July 1, 2024.
