SENATE BILL NO. 2641

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-15-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE PROHIBITION AGAINST HUNTING ON ANY STREET, PUBLIC ROAD, PUBLIC HIGHWAY, LEVEE OR RAILROAD IN ORDER TO COMPLY WITH SECTION 12 OF THE MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION AND THE SECOND 5 AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION AS INTERPRETED BY THE 6 UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT IN DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA V. HELLER, 554 7 U.S. 570 (2008), AND NEW YORK RIFLE & PISTOL ASSOCIATION, INC. V. BRUEN, 597 U.S. 1 (2022); AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 10 SECTION 1. Section 97-15-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

22	(* * \star 2) If any person * * * discharges or attempts to
23	discharge any firearm in, on or across any street, public road,
24	public highway, levee, railroad or the right-of-way thereof, such
25	person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be
26	punished by a fine not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor
27	more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the
28	county jail for not less than sixty (60) days nor more than six
29	(6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. This
30	subsection shall not apply to any law enforcement officer while in
31	the performance of his official duty or to any person engaged in a
32	lawful action of self-defense or protection of his property or
33	livestock. It shall not be a violation of this section to
34	lawfully be in possession of a firearm in a motor vehicle, or to
35	ingress or egress from a motor vehicle parked on a right-of-way to
36	lawfully access a site off the right-of-way or return from a
37	lawfully accessed site off the right-of-way.
38	(* * $\frac{1}{3}$) If any person shall willfully shoot any firearms
39	or hurl any missile at any street, highway or railroad traffic
40	light; street, highway or railroad marker or other sign for the
41	regulation or designation of street, highway or railroad travel,
42	such person, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One
43	Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars
44	(\$500.00), or be imprisoned not longer than thirty (30) days in
45	the county jail, or both.

46	(* * ± 4) It shall be the duty of all sheriffs, deputy
47	sheriffs, constables, conservation officers and peace officers of
48	this state to enforce the provisions of this section.
49	$(***\underline{5})$ If any subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause,
50	phrase or any part of this section is hereafter declared to be
51	unconstitutional or void, or if for any reason is declared to be
52	invalid or of no effect, the remaining subsections, paragraphs,
53	sentences, clauses, phrases or parts thereof shall be in no manner
54	affected thereby but shall remain in full force and effect.
55	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
56	and after July 1, 2024.
