(1) It shall be unlawful to knowingly enter the lands of another without the permission of or without being 13 14 accompanied by the landowner or the lessee of the land, or the agent of such landowner or lessee, to hunt, shoot * * * or 15 16 trap * * * on the lands or leases of another * * *. 17 (2) A violation of subsection (1) of this section shall be a 18 misdemeanor punishable as provided in Section 97-17-87. 19 (3) A second or subsequent violation of subsection (1) of 20 this section shall also require forfeiture of all hunting,
