SENATE BILL NO. 2669

AN ACT TO ENACT THE MISSISSIPPI DYSLEXIA EDUCATION FUNDING ACT; TO DEFINE TERMS; TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL SCHOOLS FUNDING GRANT PROGRAM TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING DYSLEXIA THERAPY TO AID 5 STUDENTS WITH DYSLEXIA AS WELL AS TO FUND DYSLEXIA THERAPISTS OR SUPPORT STAFF IN SCHOOLS; TO PROVIDE THAT EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT 7 SHALL RECEIVE A MINIMUM AMOUNT UNDER THE GRANT PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE REMAINING FUNDS IN THE GRANT PROGRAM SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED 8 9 UPON APPLICATION; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO PROMULGATE RULES 10 AND REGULATIONS TO ADMINISTER THE GRANT PROGRAM; TO CREATE THE DYSLEXIA EDUCATION FUND AS A SPECIAL FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY; 11 12 TO PROVIDE THAT MONIES APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE FUND MAY BE USED TO 13 REIMBURSE ACTUAL OVERSIGHT COSTS UP TO A CERTAIN AMOUNT; AND FOR 14 RELATED PURPOSES. 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 16
- 17 "Mississippi Dyslexia Education Funding Act."
- SECTION 2. For purposes of this act, the following words 18
- 19 shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context clearly
- requires otherwise: 20
- 21 (a) "Department" means the State Department of

- 22 Education.
- 23 "Dyslexia" means a specific learning disability (b)
- that is neurological in origin, characterized by difficulties with 24

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25	accurate	and	fluent	word	recognition	and	poor	spelling	and

- 26 decoding abilities, which typically result from a deficit in the
- 27 phonological component of language that is often unexpected in
- 28 relation to other cognitive abilities and the provision of
- 29 effective classroom instruction, and secondary consequences which
- 30 may include problems in reading comprehension and reduced reading
- 31 experience that can impede growth of vocabulary and background
- 32 knowledge.
- 33 (c) "Dyslexia therapy" means an appropriate specialized
- 34 dyslexia instructional program that is delivered by a Mississippi
- 35 Department of Education licensed dyslexia therapist which is
- 36 scientific, research-based, Orton-Gillingham based, and is offered
- 37 in a small group setting to teach students the components of
- 38 reading instruction which include:
- 39 (i) Phonemic awareness to enable students to
- 40 detect, segment, blend and manipulate sounds in spoken language;
- 41 (ii) Graphophonemic knowledge (phonics) for
- 42 teaching the letter-sound plan of English;
- 43 (iii) The entire structure of the English language
- 44 that encompasses morphology, semantics, syntax and pragmatics;
- 45 (iv) Linquistic instruction directed toward
- 46 proficiency and fluency with the patterns of language so that
- 47 words and sentences are carriers of meaning; and
- 48 (v) Strategies that students use for decoding,
- 49 encoding, word recognition, fluency and comprehension.

50	These components shall be taught using instructional
51	approaches that include explicit, direct instruction which is
52	systematic, sequential and cumulative, following a logical plan of
53	presenting the alphabetic principle commensurate with the
54	students' needs, with no assumption of prior skills or language
55	knowledge; individualized to meet the specific learning needs of
56	each individual student in a small group setting; intensive,
57	highly concentrated instruction that maximizes student engagement
58	and uses specialized methods and materials; meaning-based
59	instruction directed toward purposeful reading and writing, with
60	an emphasis on comprehension and composition; and multisensory
61	instruction that incorporates the simultaneous use of two (2) or
62	more sensory pathways during teacher presentations and student
63	practice.

- (d) "Dyslexia therapist" means a professional who has
 completed training in a department approved Orton-Gillingham based
 dyslexia therapy training program attaining an AA license in
 dyslexia therapy or a professional participating in a state
 approved dyslexia therapy training program to attain an AA license
 in dyslexia therapy.
- 70 (e) "Grant program" means the Mississippi Dyslexia
 71 Education Funding Grant Program established in this act.
- 72 (f) "Mississippi Dyslexia Therapy Scholarship for 73 Students with Dyslexia Program" means a scholarship to provide the 74 option to attend a public school other than the one to which is

- 75 assigned, or to provide a scholarship to a nonpublic school of
- 76 choice, for students in Grade 1 through Grade 12 diagnosed with
- 77 dyslexia in order to receive comprehensive multisensory dyslexia
- 78 therapy delivered by holders of an appropriate license in dyslexia
- 79 therapy issued by the department.
- 80 (g) "School" means any public school district, any
- 81 agricultural high school, the Mississippi School for the Deaf and
- 82 Blind, the Mississippi School of the Arts and the Mississippi
- 83 School for Mathematics and Science and any public charter school.
- SECTION 3. (1) There is established the Mississippi
- 85 Dyslexia Education Funding Grant Program which shall be
- 86 administered by the department for the purpose of providing
- 87 dyslexia therapy to aid students with dyslexia as well as to fund
- 88 dyslexia therapists or support staff in schools.
- 89 (2) The department shall distribute grants to each school.
- 90 Each school shall receive a grant in the amount of at least One
- 91 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) under the grant program by
- 92 October 1, 2024. The remaining funds in the grant program shall
- 93 be distributed upon application to the department until the funds
- 94 are depleted.
- 95 (3) The department shall promulgate rules and regulations to
- 96 administer the grant program.
- 97 (4) The department shall provide an annual report to the
- 98 Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House and Governor concerning

- 99 the distribution of funds under this grant program. The report 100 shall be filed by December 1 of each year.
- 101 **SECTION 4.** (1) There is created a special fund in the State
- 102 Treasury to be known as the "Dyslexia Education Fund" which shall
- 103 consist of monies from any source designated for deposit into the
- 104 fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a
- 105 fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any
- 106 investment earnings or interest earned on amounts in the fund
- 107 shall be deposited to the credit of the fund.
- 108 (2) (a) Monies in the fund shall be disbursed by the
- 109 department for the purposes described in this act.
- 110 (b) In addition to the purposes in paragraph (a) of
- 111 this subsection, monies appropriated out of the fund may be used
- 112 to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary oversight costs
- incurred by the department in providing grants or loans under this
- 114 section. The department shall maintain an accounting of actual
- 115 costs and expenses incurred for which reimbursement is sought for
- 116 each grant or loan. Reimbursement of reasonable actual and
- 117 necessary costs and expenses for assistance shall not exceed one
- 118 and twenty-five one-hundredths percent (1.25%) of the monies
- 119 appropriated out of the fund. Reimbursements made under this
- 120 paragraph shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
- 121 requirements.
- 122 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 123 and after its passage.
