## SENATE BILL NO. 2680

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 29-3-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE CERTAIN PROVISIONS RELATED TO SIXTEENTH SECTION LAND LEASES
- 3 CLASSIFIED AS AGRICULTURAL; TO REQUIRE THAT SUCH LEASES CONTAIN
- 4 PROVISIONS RELATED TO BEST FARM MANAGEMENT PRACTICES AS
- 5 ESTABLISHED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE IN CONSULTATION WITH THE
- 6 FEDERAL AGRICULTURE AGENCIES, MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY
- 7 AGRICULTURE EXTENSION SERVICE, OR OTHER AGRICULTURE ASSOCIATIONS;
- 8 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 29-3-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 29-3-81. (1) Sixteenth section lands, or any lands granted
- 13 in lieu of sixteenth section lands, classified as agricultural may
- 14 be leased \* \* \*, for a term not to exceed ten (10) years. \* \* \*
- 15 All leases of land classified as agricultural shall be for a term
- 16 to expire on December 31 and shall contain provisions related to
- 17 best farm management practices as established by the Secretary of
- 18 State in consultation with Federal Agriculture Agencies,
- 19 Mississippi State University Agriculture Extension Service, or
- 20 other agriculture associations.

21	(2) * * * $\frac{1}{1}$ shall be the duty of the board of education to
22	lease the sixteenth section or lieu lands at public contract after
23	having advertised such lands for rent in a newspaper published in
24	the county or, if no newspaper is published in the county, then in
25	a newspaper having a general circulation therein, for two (2)
26	successive weeks, the first being at least ten (10) days before
27	the public contract. The publication shall be not more than four
28	(4) months before the expiration of the term of an existing lease
29	of the land. The managing board may also publish additional
30	notices at school offices, in trade publications, or at any other
31	location, in any other media, or by any other means it finds
32	likely to result in competitive bids.
33	The lease form and the terms so prescribed shall be on file
34	and available for inspection in the office of the superintendent
35	from and after the public notice by advertisement and until
36	finally accepted by the board. * * * The board of education may
37	require bidders to furnish bond or submit evidence of financial
38	ability.
39	An election by the holder of the existing lease not to
40	request an extension of lease as described in subsection (3) shall
41	not preclude his participation in the bidding process established
42	under this section. Subject to the classification of the land,
43	the board of education shall enter into a new lease on

agricultural land before the expiration of an existing lease on

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45	the same land, and the new lease shall take effect on the day
46	immediately following the day on which the existing lease expires
47	Before the expiration of a current existing lease of land
48	classified as agricultural land, except as otherwise provided in
49	subsection (4) for lands intended to be reclassified, the board of
50	education, in its discretion and subject to the prior approval of
51	the Secretary of State, may authorize the holder of the existing
52	lease to re-lease the land, on no more than one (1) occasion, for
53	a term not to exceed ten (10) years and for a rental amount and
54	lease terms related to best farm management practice as
55	established by the Secretary of State in consultation with Federal
56	Agriculture Agencies, Mississippi State University Agriculture
57	Extension Service, or other agriculture association
58	Bids received by the board of education in response to the
59	advertisement shall be opened at a regular or special meeting of
60	the board. The board of education, at its option, may reject all
61	bids or accept the highest and best bid received in response to
62	the advertisement, or the board of education may hold an auction
63	among those who submitted bids in response to the advertisement.
64	If the board of education elects to hold an auction, no bidder
65	shall be granted any preference. The opening bid at the auction
66	shall be highest bid received in response to the advertisement.
67	( * * $\frac{1}{2}$ ) If, during the final year of an existing lease,
68	the board of education notifies the holder of the existing lease
69	that the board of education intends to reclassify the land under

- 70 Section 29-3-39, the holder of the existing lease may re-lease the
- 71 land for a term of five (5) years and for a rental amount that is
- 72 equal to one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the total rental
- 73 value of the then existing lease. Thereafter, the board of
- 74 education shall have the option to proceed with the
- 75 reclassification of the land or may re-lease the land for one (1)
- 76 additional term of five (5) years after advertising for bids or
- 77 holding an auction in the same manner as provided in subsection
- 78 (1) of this section, and the new classification will be
- 79 implemented upon the expiration of the then existing lease. This
- 80 subsection does not apply if the board of education intends to
- 81 reclassify the land under the "commercial" or "industrial" land
- 82 classification based on a valid business proposal presented to and
- 83 approved by the board of education.
- 84 (\* \* \*4) (a) If the board of education receives an
- 85 acceptable bid in response to the advertisement and elects not to
- 86 hold an auction among those submitting bids, then the holder of
- 87 the existing lease may submit a second bid in an amount not less
- 88 than one hundred five percent (105%) of the highest acceptable bid
- 89 received if the holder of the existing lease: (i) submitted a bid
- 90 in response to the advertisement; and (ii) constructed or made
- 91 improvements on the leasehold premises after receiving approval of
- 92 the board of education during the term of the existing lease. For
- 93 purposes of this subsection, the term "improvements" shall not
- 94 include any work or items that are done customarily on an annual

- 95 basis in the preparing, planting, growing, cultivating or
- 96 harvesting of crops or other farm products.
- 97 If the holder of the existing lease elects to
- submit a second bid, the board of education shall hold an auction 98
- 99 among those who submitted bids in response to the advertisement.
- 100 The opening bid at the auction shall be the second bid of the
- 101 holder of the existing lease. However, no leaseholder may submit
- 102 a second bid if: (i) any rent, taxes or other payment required
- 103 under his lease are past due; or (ii) he is otherwise in default
- 104 of any term or provision of the lease and such default has not
- been corrected or cured to the satisfaction of the board of 105
- 106 education after more than thirty (30) days' notice to the
- 107 leaseholder of the default.
- 108 If an auction is held, the auction may be conducted
- 109 at the meeting at which bids are opened or at a subsequent regular
- 110 or special meeting. The board shall announce the time and place
- 111 of the auction at the meeting at which bids are opened, and no
- further notice of the auction is required. 112
- 113 If no bid acceptable to the board of education is (d)
- 114 received after the advertisement or at auction, the board of
- 115 education may lease, within ninety (90) days, the lands by private
- 116 contract for an amount greater than the highest bid previously
- rejected in order to acquire a fair rental value for the lands. 117
- 118 If no bids are received in response to the advertisement, the
- board of education may negotiate a private contract for a fair 119

- rental value, and the term of such contract shall expire on

  December 31 of the same calendar year in which the contract is

  made. The board of education may take the notes for the rent and

  attend to their collection. The board has the right and remedies

  for the security and collection of such rents given by law to the
- 126 If an existing lease is terminated before the 127 expiration of the term originally set therein, upon finding that 128 immediate action is necessary to prevent damage or loss to growing crops or to prevent loss of opportunity to lease the land for the 129 130 current growing season, the board of education may negotiate a private contract for a fair rental value, and the term of such 131 132 lease shall expire on December 31 of the same calendar year in 133 which the contract is made.
