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## SENATE BILL NO. 2683

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-13-181 THROUGH 37-13-185, 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO MANDATE A COMPREHENSIVE K-12 PROGRAM FOR CHARACTER EDUCATION EFFECTIVE WITH THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR AND TO PRESCRIBE CHARACTER TRAITS TO BE THE FOCUS OF STUDENT 5 DEVELOPMENT UNDER THE PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF 6 EDUCATION TO REVIEW SCHOOL DISTRICTS' PROPOSED CHARACTER EDUCATION 7 PROGRAMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 37-13-181, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 11 37-13-181. The local school boards of the public school districts \* \* \* are authorized and directed to develop and 12 13 implement, at the beginning of the \* \* \* 2024-2025 school year, a 14 comprehensive program for character education in Grades K-12. This program of character education shall focus on students' 15 16 development of the following character traits: courage, patriotism, citizenship, honesty, fairness, respect for and 17 18 obedience to the law, respect for others, kindness, cooperation, self-respect, self-control, courtesy, compassion, tolerance, 19

diligence, generosity, punctuality, cleanliness, cheerfulness,

- 21 school pride, respect for the environment, patience, creativity,
- 22 sportsmanship, loyalty and perseverance. Said program of
- 23 character education shall include the Pledge of Allegiance to the
- 24 flag as required in Section 37-13-7, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 25 The definition of the character traits chosen by the school
- 26 district for implementation shall reflect and be in keeping with
- 27 both the spirit and the letter of the following founding
- 28 documents: the Mississippi Constitution of 1890; the Constitution
- 29 of the United States of America; the Declaration of Independence;
- 30 and state and federal law. A public school may not define or
- 31 teach character or character traits in any manner that might
- 32 promote or encourage students to participate in conduct that would
- 33 violate any state or federal law.
- 34 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-13-183, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 35 amended as follows:
- 36 37-13-183. \* \* \* Effective with the 2024-2025 school year,
- 37 assessment of the students' understanding of the character traits
- 38 chosen to be taught in public school shall be limited to and must
- 39 reflect the material taught in the classroom. Students shall not
- 40 be evaluated in any way as to whether or not the students evidence
- 41 a specific character trait in their own lives.
- 42 **SECTION 3.** Section 37-13-185, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 43 amended as follows:
- 44 37-13-185. \* \* \* Effective with the 2024-2025 school year
- 45 the State Board of Education shall review the proposed character

- 46 education programs of the individual school districts to ascertain
- 47 if the programs comply with the criteria set forth in Section
- 48 37-13-181, and develop an annual report thereon to the
- 49 Legislature. Review of the programs shall not exceed a time
- 50 period of sixty (60) days. If a review extends beyond this time
- 51 period, the proposal will be deemed in compliance with the law.
- If the proposed character education program is rejected, the
- 53 State Board of Education shall set forth in writing the specific
- 54 areas of objection. These objections must be based on and limited
- 55 to the following criteria: the definition of the character traits
- 56 chosen by the school district for implementation shall reflect and
- 57 be in keeping with both the spirit and letter of our founding
- 58 documents; no instruction shall promote or encourage participation
- 59 in any conduct that would violate existing state or federal law;
- 60 and no student shall be assessed or evaluated as to whether or not
- 61 the student evidences a specific character trait in his or her own
- 62 life.
- 63 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 64 and after July 1, 2024.
