SENATE BILL NO. 2847

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE EACH TOWN IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI WITH A SHORT-LINE RAILROAD PARTIALLY WITHIN ITS TOWN LIMITS TO CARRY OUT AND IMPLEMENT, BY AND THROUGH ITS GOVERNING AUTHORITIES, THE ACQUISITION, RESTORATION, CONSTRUCTION, OWNERSHIP, OPERATION 5 AND DISPOSITION OF SUCH SHORT-LINE RAILROAD; TO DEFINE TERMS; TO 6 PROVIDE FOR THE REVERSION OF THE SHORT-LINE RAILROAD TO THE PRIOR 7 OWNER IF A SUCCESSOR GOVERNING AUTHORITY OF THE TOWN CHOOSES TO TERMINATE THE SHORT-LINE RAILROAD PROJECT OR TRANSFER OWNERSHIP OF 8 9 AN ACOUIRED SHORT-LINE RAILROAD; THE ENUMERATION OF ANY SPECIFIC RIGHTS AND POWERS CONTAINED IN THIS ACT SHALL BE CONSTRUED BROADLY 10 TO EFFECTUATE THE PURPOSES OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 11

- 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 13 **SECTION 1.** As used in this act:
- 14 (a) "Governing authorities" means the duly elected
- 15 mayor and board of aldermen or council, as applicable, of a town.
- 16 (b) "Prior owner" means the entity that conveyed the
- 17 short-line railroad to the town. "Prior owner" includes any
- 18 subsidiary, parent company, assignee, licensee or successor in
- 19 interest of the prior owner.
- 20 (c) "Short-line railroad project" means any combination
- 21 of the acquisition, restoration, construction, ownership,

- 24 (d) "Short-line railroad" means a rail line less than
- 25 fifty (50) total route miles in length together with the line's
- 26 corresponding right of way, fixtures, facilities and related
- 27 improvements, and that, as an independent operating concern, would
- 28 qualify under the standards of the U.S. Surface Transportation
- 29 Board as a Class III rail carrier under 49 C.F.R. Section 1201
- 30 (1-1).
- 31 (e) "Town" means a municipal corporation existing with
- 32 the State of Mississippi classified as a town under Section
- 33 21-1-1, with a short-line railroad partially located within its
- 34 municipal boundaries.
- 35 **SECTION 2.** (1) A town, acting through its governing
- 36 authorities, may:
- 37 (a) Undertake a short-line railroad project; and
- 38 (b) Acquire a short-line railroad, whether such
- 39 short-line railroad relates to real property within or without the
- 40 corporate limits of the town.
- 41 (2) (a) Acquisition of a short-line railroad under
- 42 subsection (1)(b) of this section shall be on such terms and
- 43 conditions and for such considerations deemed by the governing
- 44 authorities, in their sole determination to be in the best
- 45 interest of the public and in accordance with the premises and
- 46 provisions of this act.

47	(b) If a successor governing authority of a town
48	chooses to terminate the short-line railroad project or transfer
49	ownership of an acquired short-line railroad, the short-line
50	railroad shall revert to the prior owner.

- 51 The acquisition shall be evidenced by a resolution 52 duly adopted and entered on the minutes of the governing 53 authorities.
- SECTION 3. In effectuating the purposes of this act, a town 54 55 may:
- 56 Oversee all aspects of a short-line railroad (a) 57 project, including, without limitation, entering into and 58 executing agreements with planning and development districts and 59 private third parties for project management and consulting 60 services associated with any and all aspects of the short-line railroad project, entering into and executing such agreements with 61 62 third-party contractors for the restoration and construction of 63 the short-line railroad and any improvements thereto, and entering 64 into and executing such agreements with third-party contractors 65 for the maintenance of the short-line railroad, in each case as 66 the governing authorities deem necessary or advisable to carry-out 67 the short-line railroad project, whether such restoration, construction and maintenance shall occur within or without the 68 69 corporate limits of the town.
- Enter into and execute such agreements with 70 (b) third-party rail line operators for the operation of the 71

- 72 short-line railroad that is the subject of the short-line railroad
- 73 project, on such terms and conditions the governing authorities
- 74 deem necessary, in the best interest of the public or advisable to
- 75 carry-out the short-line railroad project, whether such operation
- 76 shall occur within or without the corporate limits of the town.
- 77 (c) Engage additional third parties and enter into such
- 78 agreements reasonably necessary or required for the short-line
- 79 railroad project, and to acquire, purchase, install, lease,
- 80 finance, construct, own, hold, equip, control, maintain, use,
- 81 operate and repair structures and equipment necessary and
- 82 convenient for the planning, development, use, operation and
- 83 maintenance of the short-line railroad that is the subject of the
- 84 short-line railroad project, including, but not limited to,
- 85 utility installations.
- 86 (d) Sell, lease, trade, exchange, encumber or otherwise
- 87 dispose of the short-line railroad that is the subject of the
- 88 short-line railroad project and structures and equipment related
- 89 thereto to individuals, firms or corporations, public or private,
- 90 for all types of utility, industrial, commercial, agricultural or
- 91 other economic development uses upon such terms and conditions,
- 92 for such consideration, and with such safeguards as will best
- 93 promote and protect the public interest, convenience and
- 94 necessity, and to execute options, rights of first refusal, deeds,
- 95 leases, contracts, access or use agreements, easements and other
- 96 legal instruments necessary or convenient therefor.

97	(e) Employ engineers, attorneys, accountants,
98	consultants and such executive and administrative personnel and
99	other employees or independent contractors as shall be reasonably
100	necessary to carry out the short-line railroad project and the
101	duties and authority authorized by this act, to determine their
102	qualifications and duties, and to establish compensation and other
103	employment benefits as may be advisable to attract and retain
104	proficient personnel.

- (f) Buy, lease, sell, convey and do all other necessary business transactions for carrying out the short-line railroad project and to do all acts necessary and convenient to operate and carry out the duties of such town pursuant to such short-line railroad project.
- 110 (g) Take all actions and expend any such state, federal 111 or other funds of the town as necessary to carry out any action or 112 agreement authorized pursuant to this act for the short-line 113 railroad project.
- (h) Accept from any public or private agency, or from any individual, grants for or in aid of the short-line railroad project.
- (i) Receive and accept contributions from any source of
 money or property or other things of value to be held, used and
 applied only for the purposes for which such grants or
 contributions may be made.

- 123 (k) Contract with any agency of the State of
- 124 Mississippi, or any state adjacent thereto, and the United States
- 125 in furtherance of a short-line railroad project.
- (1) Authorized and empowered to adopt any and all
- 127 lawful resolutions, orders and ordinances, to execute such
- 128 documents, contracts, leases, certificates and indentures.
- 129 (m) Do and perform any and all acts necessary and
- 130 requisite to carry out the purposes of this act.
- 131 **SECTION 4.** (1) The enumeration of any specific rights and
- 132 powers contained in this act shall be construed broadly to
- 133 effectuate the purposes of this act.
- 134 (2) Nothing in this act should be construed to limit,
- 135 restrict or otherwise alter the duties, responsibilities and
- 136 authority of a governing authority as provided under the any
- 137 provision of law, rule, regulation or the Mississippi Constitution
- 138 of 1890.
- 139 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 140 and after its passage.
