The following sum of money, or so much thereof as 17

may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the proceeds from

22	education and general operations of Alcorn State University, Delta

- 139 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 140 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 141 SECTION 17. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 142
