4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the operation and
8	support of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
10	\$ 218,060,872.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
13	Treasury to the credit of the special funds specified herein to
14	the Mississippi Community College Board for the operation and
15	support of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal
16	year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
17	\$ 63,385,786.00.

18	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
19	act, Sixty-two Million Seven Hundred Eighty-five Thousand Seven
20	Hundred Eighty-six Dollars (\$62,785,786.00) shall be derived from
21	funds in the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to
22	Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, not
23	otherwise appropriated, for the operation and support of public
24	community and junior colleges.

SECTION 4. The funds provided in this section shall be
allocated for the aid and support of the public and community
junior colleges through the community college support funding
formula and shall be apportioned in accordance with the following
assigned weights:

43	Associate Degree Allied Health funds shall be disbursed on the
44	basis of prior year full-time equivalency (FTE) of hours generated
45	during the summer, fall and spring semesters for each public
46	community and junior college student actually enrolled and in
47	attendance the last day of the sixth week of each semester, or its
48	equivalent, counting only students who reside within the State of
49	Mississippi. However, associate degree nursing students who
50	reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay
51	purposes.
52	The Director of the Mississippi Community College Board, or
53	his designee, shall audit each public community and junior college
54	and shall determine who shall be counted in each college and shall
55	certify the number to the Mississippi Community College Board.
56	If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at
57	the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate
58	in this appropriation, as provided for in this section, the
59	Mississippi Community College Board shall find and determine that
60	any such public or community junior college does not have
61	sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary expenses of
62	its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2024, until
63	distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, then, in that
64	event, the Mississippi Community College Board is expressly
65	authorized to make an advance to any such public community or
66	junior college or colleges not having sufficient operating funds

67	for such period from the funds appropriated hereby; provided,
68	however, that the amount of any such advance to any one (1) public
69	community or junior college shall not exceed thirty-three percent
70	(33%) of the amount of state-appropriated funds received by such
71	public community or junior college during the preceding fiscal
72	year; and provided, further, that the amount of any such advance
73	shall be deducted from the pro rata part of the funds appropriated
74	hereby accruing to said public community or junior college when
75	enrollment has been ascertained and distribution of funds is made.

- (a) Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, an amount not to exceed One Hundred Sixty-seven Million Eight Hundred Eighty-one Thousand Four Hundred Four Dollars (\$167,881,404.00) is authorized for the aid and support of the public community colleges to be distributed through the community college support funding formula.
- Of the funds provided in Section 3 of this act, 82 (b) 83 Forty-nine Million Eight Hundred Eighty-four Thousand Nine 84 Hundred Forty-six Dollars (\$49,884,946.00), or so much as 85 may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Education Enhancement 86 87 Fund and deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. These funds are 88 89 authorized for the aid and support of the public community 90 colleges to be distributed through the community college 91 support funding formula.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget

Office a comprehensive report on the number of dropouts that have enrolled in a High School Equivalency and/or career program for each community and junior college during Fiscal Year 2024 on, or before, August 1, 2025.

SECTION 13. Of the funds provided in Section 3 of this act, Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Education Enhancement Fund and deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of These funds shall be used for the Career and Technical Advantage Program which will provide start-up costs for new career and technical programs, expansion of existing career and technical programs, and infrastructure for career and technical program equipment, lab upgrades, and renovations to sustain the programs at public community colleges. Fifteen percent (15%) of the funds appropriated in this section shall be distributed evenly to each community college. The remaining eighty-five percent (85%) of the funds shall be distributed on the basis of prior year career and technical full-time equivalency (FTE) hours generated during the summer, fall, and spring semesters for each public community college.

236	SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that none	j
237	of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the	j
238	purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any	
239	public community and junior college employee who is serving as a	
240	member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.	

241	SECTION 16. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition
242	(MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi
243	resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation
244	regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of
245	enrollment, as set out in Section 37-155-5(d)(iii), Mississippi
246	Code of 1972.
247	SECTION 17. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
248	of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain
249	utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such
250	utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane,
251	cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined,
252	the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance
253	with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall
254	include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not
255	include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities
256	shall be prohibited.
257	SECTION 18. It is the intention of the Legislature that
258	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
259	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
260	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
261	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
262	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
263	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are

made without competitive bids.

265	SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
266	support of the community and junior colleges shall maintain
267	complete accounting and personnel records related to the
268	expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
269	records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
270	maintained for Fiscal Year 2024. It is further the intention of
271	the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
272	2026 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
273	in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
274	of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request
275	process.

- 276 SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 277 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 278 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 279 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 280 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 281 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 282 actions contrary to this provision.
- 283 SECTION 21. The funds disbursed under the provisions of this 284 act shall be accounted for through the Mississippi Community 285 College Board. No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be 286 used by the Mississippi Community College Board for administrative 287 or other purposes except in the manner and to the extent 288 authorized in this act making an appropriation for the expenses of the Mississippi Community College Board. 289

SECTION 22. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
SECTION 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed from and after
June 30, 2024.
