20	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
21	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
22	Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds
23	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
24	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi
25	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
26	personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
27	shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
28	consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year

- 80 **SECTION 6.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 81 local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the
- 82 Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their
- 83 contribution to the Department of Public Safety.
- **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 85 Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the
- 86 Office of Forensics Laboratories in the billing and collecting of
- 87 all fees charged for services rendered by the Office of Forensics
- 88 Laboratories.
- 89 **SECTION 8.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be
- 90 transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for
- 91 the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication
- 92 activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor

It is the intention of the Legislature that all 271 divisions within the Mississippi Department of Public Safety shall 272 maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the 273 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 274 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2024. It is further the intention of 275 276 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 277 2026 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 278 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 279 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request 280 process.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2 of this act, funds may be expended to defray the costs of clothing for sworn nonuniform law enforcement officers in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually per officer.

374	SECTION 23. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
375	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital

377	Public Safety for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of
378	Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 3012, 2023
379	Regular Session, to the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal
380	year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending

382	This reappropriation is for the following purposes:

389	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,

These funds are provided for the repair and renovation to 414 415 facilities at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy excluding preplanning for the new MLEOTA Campus. 416

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417	SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions

420	derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of

423	by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for the
424	building lease for Driver Services Bureau and for building
425	improvements and equipment.
426	SECTION 28. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
427	of Section 2, One Million Five Hundred Eighty-three Thousand
428	(\$1,583,00.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be
429	derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of
430	the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303,
431	Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined
432	by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for the
433	purchase of vehicles for Capitol Police.
434	SECTION 29. With the funds appropriated herein, the
435	Department of Public Safety is authorized to make payment to
436	certain vendors for expenses incurred during Fiscal Years 2017
437	through 2023 in the following total amount\$ 29,305.00
438	SECTION 30. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
439	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
440	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
441	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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- 442 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 443 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- SECTION 31. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 445 and after July 1, 2024.
