 any other federal agency having oversight over the use of monies
 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by
 ARPA (a) determines that the agency or recipient has expended or
 otherwise used any of the funds provided to the agency under this
 section for any purpose that is not in compliance with the

362	guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or other criteria, as
363	may be amended from time to time, of the United States Department
364	of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from the Coronavirus
365	State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by the ARPA, and (b) the
366	State of Mississippi is required to repay the federal government
367	for any of those funds that the Office of the Inspector General
368	determined were expended or otherwise used improperly by the
369	agency or recipient, then the agency or recipient that expended or
370	otherwise used those funds improperly shall be required to pay the
371	amount of those funds to the State of Mississippi for repayment to
372	the federal government.

373 SECTION 24. The money appropriated by this act shall be paid
374 by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to
375 the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act,
376 upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State
377 Fiscal Officer shall issue his or her warrants upon requisitions
378 signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner
379 provided by law.

380 **SECTION 25.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 381 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed from and after 382 June 30, 2024.
