- 7 WHEREAS, the MHSAA Class 4A Championship game at Ole Miss'
- 8 Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on December 2, 2023, showed the
- 9 Louisville "Wildcats'" (15-0) dominance; and
- 10 WHEREAS, with six minutes left and Columbia down to the
- 11 21-yard line, Semaj Knowles intercepted on the 5-yard line. After
- 12 a three-and-out, Columbia's second drive to the 40-yard line
- 13 resulted in an interception in the end zone by Kameron Triplett.
- 14 There were two potential scoring drives, and two stops by
- 15 Louisville. Louisville beat three schools that reached MHSAA
- 16 championship games this year during the regular season -
- 17 Starkville, Noxubee County and West Point. These victories helped
- 18 Louisville immensely in preparation for this year's playoffs; and
