## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 49

- A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE SIX PLAYERS AND COACHES WITH STATE OF MISSISSIPPI CONNECTIONS AT SUPER BOWL LVIII BETWEEN THE KANSAS CITY CHIEFS AND THE SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS.
- WHEREAS, when the Kansas City Chiefs and San Francisco 49ers
- 5 met in Super Bowl LVIII on February 11, 2024, in Las Vegas, the
- 6 teams' roster had five players and a coach from the State of
- 7 Mississippi; and
- 8 WHEREAS, all-pro defensive lineman for the Chiefs, Chris
- 9 Jones, and all-pro cornerback for the 49ers, Charvarius Ward,
- 10 highlighted the athletes representing the Magnolia State on the
- 11 world's biggest football stage; and
- 12 WHEREAS, former Mississippi State star Chris Jones has spent
- 13 the 2023 season tormenting offensive lines for Kansas City. The
- 14 defensive tackle registered 10.5 sacks this season. He is joined
- 15 on the Chiefs by Willie Gay, Jr., who played for the Mississippi
- 16 State Bulldogs. Gay, who missed the AFC Championship Game due to
- 17 an injury, had 58 tackles, three fumble recoveries and an
- 18 interception this season; and

- 19 WHEREAS, Chris Jones, a Houston, Mississippi, native;
- 20 linebacker Willie Gay, Jr., a Starkville, Mississippi, native; and
- 21 linebacker Darius Harris, a Horn Lake, Mississippi, native all
- 22 played in a second-straight Super Bowl victory with Kansas City;
- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, Charvarius Ward, a McComb, Mississippi, native, and
- 25 Darrel Luter, Jr., a Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native, played for
- 26 the 49ers. Ward has also played in his second Super Bowl triumph,
- 27 having received a ring as a member of the Chiefs team that won the
- 28 Super Bowl in 2019. Ward later moved on to Hinds Community
- 29 College and Middle Tennessee State. He has had an outstanding
- 30 season for the 49ers, with five interceptions, doubling his
- 31 previous career total. Luter, a rookie, was is in his first Super
- 32 Bowl in just his first year in the league. He played at the
- 33 junior college level for Pearl River before moving on to South
- 34 Alabama. He's played in seven games as a rookie this season; and
- 35 WHEREAS, the Chiefs' roster also includes Horn Lake player
- 36 Darius Harris. The linebacker, who played his college football at
- 37 Middle Tennessee State, has appeared in five games this season;
- 38 and
- 39 WHEREAS, in 2023, Todd Pinkston was hired as the running
- 40 backs coach for the Kansas City Chiefs. Pinkston became a Super
- 41 Bowl Champion when the Chiefs defeated the San Francisco 49ers
- 42 25-22 in Super Bowl LVIII. At The University of Southern
- 43 Mississippi, Todd Pinkston graduated as the school's second

- 44 all-time leading receiver with 149 catches for 2,366 yards and 22
- 45 touchdowns, including 48 receptions for 977 yards and 11
- 46 touchdowns as a senior. He was inducted into the Southern Miss
- 47 Sports Hall of Fame in 2011, and was inducted into the Scott
- 48 County Sports Hall of Fame in his hometown of Forest, Mississippi,
- 49 in 2015; and
- 50 WHEREAS, former Mississippi State baseball player Brad
- 51 Freeman has been an NFL referee since 2014, and he was selected as
- 52 part of the Super Bowl LVIII crew. The Oxford native served as
- 53 the back judge in the final and most important game of the
- 54 2023-2024 season. Mississippians continue to make their mark on
- 55 NFL history, especially when it comes to officiating; and
- 56 WHEREAS, Mississippi has a legacy of professional football
- 57 excellence, and it is with great pride that we commend these stars
- 58 who well-represented Mississippi at Super Bowl LVIII. We join
- 59 their families, former communities and schools in commending these
- 60 professionals who have brought honor to the State of Mississippi:
- 61 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 62 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby recognize the six players and
- 63 coaches with State of Mississippi connections at Super Bowl LVIII
- 64 between the Kansas City Chiefs and the San Francisco 49ers, and
- 65 extend the best wishes of the Mississippi Senate for future

- 66 success.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 68 these six Super Bowl stars and their families, forwarded to the

- 69 athletic directors of their alma maters and the Board of Trustees
- 70 of State Institutions of Higher Learning, and be made available to
