1	A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING THE BLUE MOUNTAIN
2	HIGH SCHOOL "LADY COUGARS" GIRLS BASKETBALL TEAM AND COACH REGINA
3	CHILLS UPON WINNING THE MHSAA CLASS 1A GIRLS BASKETBALL STATE
4	CHAMPIONSHIP.

- 5 WHEREAS, the Blue Mountain High School "Lady Cougars" Girls
- 6 Basketball Team defeated Lumberton High School 38-36 at the
- 7 Mississippi Coliseum in the Mississippi High School Activities
- 8 Association (MHSAA) Class 1A final on February 29, 2024, for their
- 9 first State Title in their first appearance in a big-school final;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, for most of this made-for-Hollywood season, the
- 12 remarkable Blue Mountain Girls Basketball Team has been known as
- 13 the Super Six. That's because for most of the season there were
- 14 only six players, three with the last name of Foote; and
- WHEREAS, the Blue Mountain "Lady Cougars" brought a 28-1
- 16 record into the Class 1A State Championship at the Mississippi
- 17 Coliseum, known as the "Big House" throughout Mississippi high
- 18 school basketball. Rarely, if ever, has there been a smaller team
- 19 in the "Big House"; and

- 20 WHEREAS, about 800 citizens live in Blue Mountain. There are
- 21 66 students, boys and girls combined, in Grades 7 through 12. The
- 22 "Lady Cougars" play their home games on a gym floor that is
- 23 roughly about three-quarters the size of a regulation basketball
- 24 court; and
- 25 WHEREAS, now the town without a traffic light has one
- 26 gleaming Gold Ball State Championship Trophy. Despite many touch
- 27 and go moments, and a dogged effort from Lumberton, Blue Mountain
- 28 prevailed 38-36 in a strong defense struggle that turned into an
- 29 offense driven barn-burner in the fourth quarter; and
- 30 WHEREAS, as usual, only the original Super Six played for
- 31 Blue Mountain, while two younger teammates, promoted from the
- 32 junior high team late in the season, watched and cheered from the
- 33 bench. The three Footes, Keyauna and her first cousins Arare and
- 34 Beiga, made impressive play after play, especially in the fourth
- 35 quarter. Blue Mountain led 21-19 heading into the fourth quarter
- 36 when both teams started scoring regularly. Keyauna Foote scored
- 37 three straight baskets to give the "Lady Cougars" a five-point
- 38 lead midway through, but Lumberton fired back until Keyauna scored
- 39 what proved to be the winning basket on an in-bounds play with 20
- 40 seconds left; and
- 41 WHEREAS, as is always the case in the "Big House" this time
- 42 of the year, a wild celebration ensued. Of the 800 fans living in
- 43 Blue Mountain, nearly all were present and dancing in the stands;
