SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 132

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE TISHOMINGO 2 COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL "BRAVES" GIRLS BASKETBALL TEAM AND HEAD COACH 3 BRIAN MIDDLETON FOR WINNING THEIR FIRST STATE CHAMPIONSHIP. 4 WHEREAS, for Tishomingo County Girls Basketball Coach Brian Middleton, this season was all about family. He made the decision 5 6 to start eighth-grader Meg Moore alongside her sister, Reese 7 Moore, and then, to start his daughter, Baylon Middleton, at forward. Coach Middleton's decisions proved to be the right ones, 8 9 as the "Braves" easily defeated Morton 37-17 in the MHSAA 4A State Championship at the Mississippi Coliseum on March 2, 2024; and 10 11 WHEREAS, it is the first State Championship in football, basketball and baseball for Tishomingo County High School (30-3); 12 13 and 14 WHEREAS, "We have worked so hard for this," Coach Brian Middleton said. "I kept preaching this week that 'This is your 15 16 opportunity and today is the day to go do it.' We did not shy 17 away from this, and for the last two years we thought we belonged

18 at the top. We just kept figuring out how we were going to get 19 there"; and

20 WHEREAS, Morton (29-3) had trouble stopping game MVP Reese Moore who led all scorers with 14 points, along with five assists 21 22 and four steals. Her sister, Meg Moore, was the team's 23 second-leading scorer with 11 points. "It is super special to share this with my sister," Reese Moore said. "It is very 24 25 emotional. We played in the driveway growing up, always on the 26 same team, and to now play with her and get one, it feels great"; 27 and

28 WHEREAS, defense was the key for Tishomingo County. The 29 "Braves" limited Morton to six points in the first half to lead by 30 Morton began the third quarter with a 7-0 run as Nazrin Lyles 13. hit a layup and then on the next possession made a three-pointer 31 to make the score 21-13. After a timeout, a steal and assist by 32 33 Baylon Middleton fueled the "Braves" on a 10-0 run to put the game 34 out of reach; and
