House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2180

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14 15 amended as follows: 45-1-19. (1) The Department of Public Safety, through the 16 Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the 17 enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the 18 properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets, 19 20 sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set 21 forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's mansion, the Supreme Court Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation Building 22 23 and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and any 24 property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the State 25 of Mississippi for conducting state business and not specifically 26 under the supervision and care by any other state entity, but 27 which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public Safety would 28 be responsible for such. The Department of Public Safety shall, through any person or persons appointed by the commissioner, make 29 30 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of Mississippi

- 31 on the grounds of or within those properties. The Department of
- 32 Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the provisions of this
- 33 section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through
- 34 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and prescribe such rules and
- 35 regulations as are necessary therefor. The powers and duties
- 36 related to the administration of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67,
- 37 29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95 shall remain
- 38 with the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 39 (2) Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of
- 40 State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and
- 41 the Department of Public Safety shall be authorized to enter into
- 42 a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the
- 43 security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the
- 44 State of Mississippi on the property of the Board of Trustees
- 45 located at the corner of Ridgewood Road and Lakeland Drive in the
- 46 City of Jackson.
- 47 (3) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 48 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 49 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
- 50 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- 51 of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new
- 52 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and
- 53 Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County,
- 54 Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 55 Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel

- at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and responses to security system alarms.
- 58 (4) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 59 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 60 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
- 61 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department
- 62 of Agriculture known as the "Mississippi State Fairgrounds
- 63 Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and property.
- 64 The Department of Public Safety and the Department of Agriculture
- 65 are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department of
- 66 Public Safety to supply the security personnel to the Department
- 67 of Agriculture with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State
- of Mississippi on this property and any and all buildings on this
- 69 property. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to charge
- 70 the Department of Agriculture a fee for security services provided
- 71 for special events at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds Complex.
- 72 The fee charged will be commensurate with the cost associated with
- 73 the Department of Public Safety providing those services.
- 74 (5) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 75 Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department
- 76 of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with
- 77 jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi at
- 78 the Alcoholic Beverage Control facility and the Department of
- 79 Revenue main office.
- 80 (6) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall have primary
- 81 jurisdiction relative to any other state or municipal law

- 82 enforcement agency to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi
- 83 within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District
- 84 created in Section 29-5-203; such enforcement shall be its primary
- 85 function. The Department of Public Safety may, through any person
- 86 or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety, make
- 87 arrests for any violation of any law of the State of
- 88 Mississippi * * *. The Department of Public Safety may also make
- 89 arrests for any violations of the City of Jackson's * * *
- 90 ordinances * * * which * * * occur within the boundaries of the
- 91 district and within the boundaries of the City of Jackson and
- 92 which are necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of
- 93 the public. The Department of Public Safety may choose to present
- 94 cases to either the District Attorney or the prosecuting attorneys
- 95 designated by the Attorney General for prosecution of any
- 96 violation of law that accrues or occurs, in whole or in part,
- 97 within the boundaries established by Section 29-5-203. The
- 98 jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety granted under this
- 99 subsection (6) shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of the
- 100 City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of Hinds County,
- 101 Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex
- 102 Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203. At any time
- 103 and/or during any event necessitating the coordination of and/or
- 104 utilization at multiple jurisdictions, as determined by the Chief
- 105 of Capitol Police or the Commissioner of the Department of Public
- 106 Safety shall be the lead agency when the event occurs on property
- 107 as defined herein that is owned or leased by the state as provided

108 in subsection (1) of this section. The jurisdiction and authority

109 of the Department of Public Safety under this subsection (6) shall

110 be in addition to any other jurisdiction and authority provided to

- 111 the department under this section or any other law.
- 112 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall have
- 113 jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State
- 114 of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of Jackson,
- 115 Mississippi. The Department of Public Safety may, through any
- 116 person or persons appointed by the Department of Public Safety,
- make arrests for any violation of any law of the State of 117
- 118 Mississippi which occurs within the boundaries of the City of
- 119 The jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety Jackson.
- 120 granted under this paragraph (b) shall not be primary and shall be
- 121 concurrent with the jurisdiction of the City of Jackson,
- 122 Mississippi, and that of Hinds County, Mississippi.
- 123 * * *
- 124 (* * *c) The Chief of the Capitol Police and/or the
- Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, the Chief of the 125
- 126 Jackson Police Department, and the Sheriff of Hinds County shall
- 127 hold a regular meeting within the boundaries of the Capitol
- 128 Complex Improvement District to address the concerns of the
- 129 public. Each meeting shall be called by the Chief of the Capitol
- 130 Police; and the first meeting shall be called by October 15, 2023.
- 131 The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter
- into a contract with any county for the county to take custody of 132

- 133 the misdemeanor offenders arrested under the authority granted
- 134 under this section.
- 135 (8) All accrued personal leave earned pursuant to Section
- 136 25-3-93, accrued major medical leave earned pursuant to Section
- 137 25-3-95, accrued state compensatory leave earned pursuant to
- 138 Section 25-3-92, and compensatory leave earned pursuant to the
- 139 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall transfer from the Department
- 140 of Finance and Administration to the Department of Public Safety
- 141 for all employees transferred under this section.
- 142 SECTION 2. Section 9-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 143
- 144 (1) (a) From and after January 1, 2024, there 9-12-1.
- 145 shall be created one (1) inferior court as authorized by Article
- 6, Section 172 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to be 146
- located within the boundaries established in Section 29-5-203 for 147
- the Capitol Complex Improvement District, hereinafter referred to 148
- 149 as "CCID". The CCID inferior court shall have jurisdiction to
- 150 hear and determine all preliminary matters and criminal matters
- 151 authorized by law for municipal courts that accrue or occur, in
- 152 whole or in part, within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex
- 153 Improvement District; and shall have the same jurisdiction as
- 154 municipal courts to hear and determine all cases charging
- 155 violations of the motor vehicle and traffic laws of this state,
- 156 and violations of the City of Jackson's * * * ordinances or
- municipal code * * * that accrue or occur, in whole or in part, 157
- within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex Improvement District 158

- and which are necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare
- of the public.
- 161 (b) Any person convicted in the CCID inferior court may
- 162 be placed in the custody of the Mississippi Department of
- 163 Corrections, Central Mississippi facility.
- 164 (2) The Chief Justice of the Mississippi Supreme Court shall
- 165 appoint the CCID inferior court judge authorized by this section.
- 166 The judge shall possess all qualifications required by law for
- 167 municipal court judges. Such judge shall be a qualified elector
- 168 of this state, and shall have such other qualifications as
- 169 provided by law for municipal judges.
- 170 (3) The Administrative Office of Courts shall provide
- 171 compensation for the CCID inferior court judge and the support
- 172 staff of the judge. Such compensation shall not be in an amount
- 173 less than the compensation paid to municipal court judges and
- 174 their support staff in the City of Jackson.
- 175 (4) All fines, penalties, fees and costs imposed and
- 176 collected by the CCID inferior court shall be deposited with the
- 177 City of Jackson municipal treasurer or equivalent officer.
- 178 (5) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2027.
- 179 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 180 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-1-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO ENFORCE ANY CITY ORDINANCE NECESSARY TO

- 3 PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC; TO DELETE
- 4 THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT REQUIRES PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL FROM THE
- 5 CHIEF OF THE CAPITOL POLICE OR THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT
- 6 OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR EVENTS WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE ON ANY STREET OR
- 7 SIDEWALK IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO ANY BUILDING OR PROPERTY OWNED OR
- 8 OCCUPIED BY ANY OFFICIAL, AGENCY, BOARD, COMMISSION, OFFICE OR
- 9 OTHER ENTITY OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, OR WHICH CAN REASONABLY
- 10 BE EXPECTED TO BLOCK, IMPEDE OR OTHERWISE HINDER INGRESS THERETO
- 11 AND/OR EGRESS THEREFROM; TO AMEND SECTION 9-12-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE
- 12 OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
