House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3050

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
7	defraying the expenses incurred by the Mississippi Workers'
8	Compensation Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025\$ 6,007,624.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
12	Treasury to the credit of the Second Injury Fund (Fund Number
13	3352300000) for the purpose of making payments under the
14	provisions of Section 71-3-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the
15	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
16	\$ 50,000.00.
17	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
18	act, the following positions are authorized:

22 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 23 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 24 25 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 26 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 27 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal 28 services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall 29 publish. In accordance with applicable laws, if an agency 30 determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the 31 agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to 32 the personal services amount must be approved by the State 33 Personnel Director and the State Fiscal Officer after consultation with the Legislative Budget Office. Any adjustment shall be 34 reported to the Legislative Budget Office and the House and Senate 35 36 Appropriations Chairmen. The agency's personal services 37 appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may not be utilized for active 38 39 Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. It shall be the agency's 40 responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are 41 used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, 42 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. If the State Personnel Board 43 44 determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board 45 46 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in S. B. 3050

47 the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the 48 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the 49 Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the 50 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel 51 Board.

52 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 53 54 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 55 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do 56 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If 57 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the 58 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 59 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 60 essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 61 62 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 63 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 64 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 65 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 66 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 67 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 68 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 69 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for

S. B. 3050 PAGE 3 72 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 73 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

78 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 79 Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission shall maintain 80 complete accounting and personnel records related to the 81 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as 82 maintained for Fiscal Year 2024. It is further the intention of 83 84 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 85 2026 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 86 87 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request 88 process.

89 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that with 90 the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi 91 Workers' Compensation Commission shall enter into a contract with 92 the industrial private sector for the purpose of implementing a 93 safety education and training program.

94 SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 95 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 96 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 97 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the S. B. 3050 PAGE 4

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 131 132 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 133 134 Committee for Fiscal Year 2026.

135 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that 136 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 137 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 138 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 139 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 140 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 141 142 made without competitive bids.

143 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the salary of the Workers' Compensation Commission members shall be 144 145 equal and the salary of the commission chairman shall exceed these 146 salaries as approved by the State Personnel Board.

147 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 148 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 149 S. B. 3050 PAGE 6

150 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 151 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 152 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 153 actions contrary to this provision.

154 **SECTION 10.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 155 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 156 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 157 158 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 159 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 160 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed from and after 161

162 June 29, 2024.
