House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3056

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as		
5	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the		
6	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the		
7	expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority for the fiscal		
8	year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025

10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State		
12	Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Development Authority or		
13	the appropriate special fund for the purpose of defraying the		
14	expenses incurred in the operation of the various divisions of the		
15	authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending		
16	June 30, 2025\$ 323,264,410.00.		
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of		
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:

22 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 23 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 24 25 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 26 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 27 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal 28 services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall 29 publish. In accordance with applicable laws, if an agency 30 determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the 31 agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to 32 the personal services amount must be approved by the State 33 Personnel Director and the State Fiscal Officer after consultation with the Legislative Budget Office. Any adjustment shall be 34 reported to the Legislative Budget Office and the House and Senate 35 36 Appropriations Chairmen. The agency's personal services 37 appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may not be utilized for active 38 39 Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. It shall be the agency's 40 responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are 41 used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, 42 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. If the State Personnel Board 43 44 determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board 45 46 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in S. B. 3056

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47 the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the 48 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the 49 Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the 50 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel 51 Board.

52 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 53 54 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 55 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do 56 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If 57 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the 58 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 59 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 60 essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 61 62 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 63 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 64 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 65 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 66 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 67 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 68 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 69 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for

72 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 73 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this act, the amount of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) shall be provided from the Mississippi Department of Transportation to defray the expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority in operating the state welcome centers.

131 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 132 Mississippi Development Authority shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 133 134 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 135 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 136 Year 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 137 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be 138 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 139 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 140 provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.

141 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2 of 142 this act, the amount of Four Million Eight Hundred Seventy-six 143 Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$4,876,298.00), or so 144 much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of 145 supporting Mississippi Tourism Advertising and Promotion for 146 Fiscal Year 2025, and shall not be expended for any type of 147 cultural exchange program. Of the funds appropriated herein and allocated within this section, Two Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand 148

149 Dollars (\$299,000.00) is provided for Tourism Grant Development 150 Awards.

151 It is the intention of the Legislature that none SECTION 8. 152 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members 153 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 154 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public 155 156 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 157 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 158 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 159 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following 160 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the 161 Mississippi State Legislature."

162 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that 163 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 164 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 165 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 166 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 167 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 168 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 169 made without competitive bids.

170 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 171 act, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for 172 the Mississippi Delta National Heritage Areas. 173 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 174 act, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for 175 the Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority is hereby authorized to escalate, budget, and expend funds from any source not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

182 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 183 Mississippi Development Authority shall submit a notification of 184 any General Fund Transfers out of the major category Subsidies 185 into any other major categories to the Legislative Budget Office. 186 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, Twenty Thousand Twenty-five Dollars (\$20,025.00) shall be 187 188 provided for the support of the Mississippi River Parkway 189 Commission.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be transferred to Innovate Mississippi.

193 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 194 act, One Hundred Fifty-six Thousand Dollars (\$156,000.00) is 195 provided for the Energy High School Academy, established in 196 Section 37-69-7, Mississippi Code of 1972.

197 SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 198 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Fifty Thousand S. B. 3056 PAGE 8 199 Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be allocated to the Mississippi Book 200 Festival.

201 SECTION 18. Of the funds appropriated herein, Five Hundred 202 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be provided to the 203 Mississippi Main Street Association for statewide support and 204 operations.

205 SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 206 Mississippi Development Authority shall provide quarterly reports 207 on the status of Gulf Coast Restoration Fund projects to the 208 Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and 209 Administration. It is further the intention of the Legislature 210 that the Mississippi Development Authority shall provide the Joint 211 Legislative Budget Committee a detailed report and other such 212 related information on each project's expenditures with the 213 subsequent fiscal year's budget submission.

214 SECTION 20. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 215 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Gulf Coast 216 Restoration Fund not otherwise appropriated to the Mississippi 217 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the 218 expenditure of Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as provided in Senate Bill No. 3046, 2023 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning 219 220 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 744,784.00. 221 These funds are provided for administrative expenses at the 222 Mississippi Development Authority as outlined in Section 57-119-7, 223 Mississippi Code of 1972.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, the amount that may be expended under the authority of this section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2024, from the amount authorized for the previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

230 SECTION 21. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 231 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 232 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi 233 Development Authority for the purpose of reauthorizing the 234 expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the Air Service 235 Development Act, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 3046, 2023 236 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and 237 ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 246,431.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, the amount that may be expended under the authority of this section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2024, from the amount authorized for the previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

SECTION 22. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority may provide operational support to any park operated by the United States National Park Service in Mississippi during the event of a government shutdown that materially affects the operations of such park.

249 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this act, the following sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary is 250 251 appropriated out of the following funds in the State Treasury to 252 the credit of the Mississippi Development Authority for the 253 purpose of Mississippi Major Economic Impact Projects for the 254 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025: 255 Triple Crown Fund for the purposes described in Section (a) 256 57-1-651, Mississippi Code of 1972.....\$ 130,125,000.00. 257 Project Poppy Fund for the purposes described in Senate (b) Bill No. 2001, 2024 First Extraordinary 258 259 Session.....\$ 117,614,000.00. 260 Project Atlas Fund for the purposes described in House (C) 261 Bill No. 1, 2024 Second Extraordinary Session...\$ 44,000,000.00. 262 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi 263 Development Authority provide the reporting requirements of each 264 fund appropriated in this section on or before January 5 of each 265 year.

SECTION 24. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

272 SECTION 25. This act shall take effect and be in force from 273 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed from and after 274 June 29, 2024.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
