- 1 Amend after line 276 by inserting the following:
- 2 "SECTION 9. Section 37-106-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 3 amended as follows:
- 4 37-106-36. (1) There is established the "William F. Winter
- 5 and Jack Reed, Sr., Teacher Loan Repayment Program."
- 6 (2) Subject to the availability of funds, an eligible
- 7 applicant for an initial award must have:
- 8 (a) Graduated from a baccalaureate degree-granting
- 9 institution of higher learning which is regionally accredited by
- 10 the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) or a
- 11 comparable accreditation body;
- 12 (b) Signed a contract as a full-time * * * teacher in a
- 13 public school district in Mississippi;



- 14 (c) Obtained a standard five-year license or
- 15 nontraditional five-year alternate route license. Persons with
- 16 provisional emergency licenses shall not be eligible applicants;
- 17 and
- 18 (d) Outstanding qualifying undergraduate or graduate
- 19 educational loans, which may include the principal, interest and
- 20 related expenses such as the required interest premium on the
- 21 unpaid balances of government and commercial loans obtained by the
- 22 recipient for undergraduate or graduate educational expense.
- 23 (3) Persons who have received funds from other forgivable
- 24 loan programs established for teachers under Mississippi law, or
- 25 who are presently in default or delinquent on any federal, state,
- 26 local or commercial qualifying educational loan, shall not be
- 27 eligible for this program.
- 28 (4) Provided that initial recipients remain eligible under
- 29 the provisions of subsection (2) of this section, they may retain
- 30 eligibility for two (2) additional awards, subject to the
- 31 availability of funds.
- 32 (* * *5) Initial recipients shall be selected on a
- 33 first-come, first-served basis of all eligible applicants, * * \star
- 34 subject to the availability of funds. In the second and * * \star
- 35 third years of an applicant's continued eligibility, priority
- 36 consideration shall first be given to renewal applicants. * * *
- 37 The Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board
- 38 shall develop rules for ensuring that expenses of the program in a

- 39 fiscal year do not exceed funding for the program in that fiscal
- 40 year. For that purpose, and any other provisions of this section
- 41 to the contrary notwithstanding, the Mississippi Postsecondary
- 42 Education Financial Assistance Board may limit the acceptance of
- 43 applications and may limit the number of awards.
- 44 (* * *6) Among * * * teacher recipients, priority
- 45 consideration shall be given to persons who are teaching in a
- 46 public school district designated as a geographical critical
- 47 teacher shortage area by the State Board of Education.
- 48 (* * *7) Awards for recipients who have signed a contract
- 49 to teach in a public school district that is not designated as a
- 50 geographical critical teacher shortage area shall be as follows:
- 51 (a) One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for
- 52 the * * * initial award;
- 53 (b) Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for
- 54 the second \star \star award; and
- 55 (c) Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) for
- 56 the third \star \star award.
- 57 (* * *8) Awards for recipients who have signed a contract
- 58 to teach in a public school district that is designated as a
- 59 geographical critical teacher shortage area shall be as follows:
- (a) Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) for the * * *
- 61 initial award;
- 62 (b) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the
- 63 second * * * award, provided the recipient continues to teach in

- 64 the same public school district or another public school district
- 65 designated a geographical shortage area by the State Board of
- 66 Education; and
- 67 (c) Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for the
- 68 third * * * award, provided the recipient continues to teach in
- 69 the same public school district or another public school district
- 70 designated a geographical shortage area by the State Board of
- 71 Education.
- 72 (* * *9) * * * An initial recipient who moves to another
- 73 public school district shall be eligible to receive an award based
- 74 on the amount allowed under the program in the new district where
- 75 the teacher is employed.
- 76 (* * *10) Awards shall be granted on a year-to-year basis,
- 77 and recipients shall have no obligation to seek a future award.
- 78 (\star \star 11) Awards shall be paid annually, after the
- 79 expiration of the one-year teaching contract for which the award
- 80 was granted, to the recipient's lender or loan service provider,
- 81 and shall be applied to the outstanding balance. Monies paid on
- 82 the recipient's behalf toward qualifying undergraduate or graduate
- 83 educational loans prior to receiving payment of the award shall
- 84 not be eligible for repayment through the program.
- 85 (* * *12) During the teaching year for which the award is
- 86 granted, a recipient must at all times keep the * * * Mississippi
- 87 Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board informed of any

- 88 changes to the recipient's current contact information and
- 89 employment status.
- 90 (* * $\frac{13}{2}$) Recipients who fail to maintain a standard or
- 91 nontraditional license or fail to fulfill the one-year teaching
- 92 contract on which the award was based shall forfeit any right to
- 93 the award.
- 94 (* * *14) The * * * Mississippi Postsecondary Education
- 95 Financial Assistance Board, in collaboration with the State Board
- 96 of Education, shall track recipients of an award under this
- 97 program through their * * * fourth year after receiving their
- 98 initial award, unless the recipient shall leave teaching in a
- 99 public school district at an earlier date. Data collected shall
- 100 include recipients' undergraduate or graduate institution, school
- 101 district, subject area/grade level in teaching and any other
- 102 pertinent information necessary to determine the efficacy of the
- 103 program in retaining teachers * * *.
- 104 (* * *15) The * * * Mississippi Postsecondary Education
- 105 Financial Assistance Board shall promulgate regulations necessary
- 106 for the proper administration of this section, including rules for
- 107 ensuring that expenses of the program in a fiscal year do not
- 108 exceed funding for the program in that fiscal year.
- 109 (* * *16) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 110 special fund to be designated the "William F. Winter and Jack
- 111 Reed, Sr., Loan Repayment Program Fund," into which shall be
- 112 deposited those funds appropriated by the Legislature, and any

- 113 other funds that may be made available, for the purpose of
- 114 implementing the loan repayment program established herein. Money
- 115 in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse into the
- 116 General Fund, and interest earned on any amounts deposited into
- 117 the fund shall be credited to the special fund.
- 118 * * * ".
- 119 Further, amend by renumbering the succeeding section
- 120 accordingly.
- 121 Further, amend the title to conform, by inserting the
- 122 following after the semicolon on line 10:
- 123 "TO AMEND SECTION 37 106 36, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE
- 124 PROVISIONS OF THE "WILLIAM F. WINTER AND JACK REED, SR., TEACHER
- 125 LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM" FOR THE PURPOSE OF ALLOWING INDIVIDUALS
- 126 PURSUING AN ALTERNATE ROUTE LICENSURE PATHWAY TO BECOME ELIGIBLE
- 127 TO RECEIVE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE PROGRAM; TO REMOVE THE
- 128 CAP ON THE NUMBER OF APPLICANTS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE
- 129 UNDER THE PROGRAM IN ANY FISCAL YEAR;".
