25 Water Infrastructure (MCWI) Grant Program established in Section
26 49-2-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
27 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 434,200,000.00.

243 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by the United
244 States Department of the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the
245 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....

259 Section 25-31-5(2)(g), Mississippi Code of 1972, necessary to
260 respond to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic as allowable under
261 Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any
262 guidance or regulation issued by the United States Department of



263 the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year
264 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....
265\$ 464,580.00.

267 in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended

278 supplement those authorized under Section 9-7-25, Mississippi Code
279 of 1972, necessary to respond to the effects of the COVID-19
280 pandemic as allowable under Section 9901 of the American Rescue
281 Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by
282 the United States Department of the Treasury in conformity
283 therewith, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending
284 June 30, 2025.....\$ 300,000.00.

285 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
286 in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended

294 Session, and Senate Bill No. 3052, 2023 Regular Session, for the
295 purpose of funding additional special temporary courts that
296 supplement those authorized under Section 9-7-25, Mississippi Code
297 of 1972, necessary to respond to the effects of the COVID-19
298 pandemic as allowable under Section 9901 of the American Rescue
299 Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by
300 the United States Department of the Treasury in conformity
301 therewith, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending
302 June 30, 2025.....\$ 1,500,000.00.

303 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
304 in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended
305 balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2024, or change the
306 purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

307 **SECTION 21.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
308 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
309 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
310 Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board, as
311 authorized in House Bill No. 1521, 2022 Regular Session, as



312 amended by Senate Bill 2373, 2023 Regular Session, and Senate Bill
313 No. 3052, 2023 Regular Session, for the purpose of providing
314 funding for the Skilled Nursing Home and Hospital Nurses Retention
315 Loan Repayment Program, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
316 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 6,000,000.00.

317 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
318 in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended
319 balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2024, or change the
320 purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

321 **SECTION 22.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
322 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
323 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated to the
324 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized in Senate
325 Bill No. 3064, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of funding
326 the Independent Schools Infrastructure Grant Program established
327 in Senate Bill No. 2780, 2022 Regular Session, and Senate Bill
328 3052, 2023 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
329 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 10,000,000.00.

330 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
331 in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended
332 balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2024, or change the
333 purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

334 **SECTION 23.** None of the funds reappropriated in this act
335 shall be used to pay employee premium payments.



336 **SECTION 24.** (1) As used in this section, the term "agency"
337 shall mean the entities in which funds were reappropriated in
338 Sections 1 through 21 of this act.

339 (2) The agency shall not disburse any funds provided under
340 this section to any recipient without first: (a) making an
341 individualized determination that the reimbursement sought is, in
342 the agency's independent judgment, for necessary expenditures
343 eligible under Section 602 of the federal Social Security Act as
344 added by Section 9901 of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of
345 2021 (ARPA) and its implementing guidelines, guidance, rules,
346 regulations and/or other criteria, as may be amended or
347 supplemented from time to time, by the United States Department of
348 the Treasury; and (b) determining that the recipient has not
349 received and will not receive reimbursement for the expense in
350 question from any source of funds, including insurance proceeds,
351 other than those funds provided under Section 602 of the federal
352 Social Security Act as added by Section 9901 of ARPA. In
353 addition, the agency shall ensure that all funds provided under
354 this section are disbursed in compliance with the Single Audit Act
355 (31 USC Sections 7501-7507) and the related provisions of the
356 Uniform Guidance, 2 CFR Section 200.303 regarding internal
357 controls, Sections 200.330 through 200.332 regarding sub-recipient
358 monitoring and management, and subpart F regarding audit
359 requirements.



360 (3) As a condition of receiving and expending the funds
361 provided to the agency under this section, the agency shall
362 certify to the Department of Finance and Administration that each
363 expenditure of the funds provided to the agency under this section
364 complies with the guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or
365 other criteria, as may be amended from time to time, of the United
366 States Department of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from
367 the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by ARPA.

368 (4) If the Office of Inspector General of the United States
369 Department of the Treasury, or the Office of Inspector General of
370 any other federal agency having oversight over the use of monies
371 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by
372 ARPA (a) determines that the agency or recipient has expended or
373 otherwise used any of the funds provided to the agency under this
374 section for any purpose that is not in compliance with the
375 guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or other criteria, as
376 may be amended from time to time, of the United States Department
377 of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from the Coronavirus
378 State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by the ARPA, and (b) the
379 State of Mississippi is required to repay the federal government
380 for any of those funds that the Office of the Inspector General
381 determined were expended or otherwise used improperly by the
382 agency or recipient, then the agency or recipient that expended or
383 otherwise used those funds improperly shall be required to pay the



384 amount of those funds to the State of Mississippi for repayment to
385 the federal government.

386 **SECTION 25.** The money appropriated by this act shall be paid
387 by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to
388 the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act,
389 upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State
390 Fiscal Officer shall issue his or her warrants upon requisitions
391 signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner
392 provided by law.

393 **SECTION 26.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
394 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed from and after
395 June 30, 2024.

inserting in lieu thereof the following:**
