Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1025

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 47-5-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 47-5-8. (1) There is created the Mississippi Department of
- 10 Corrections, which shall be under the policy direction of the
- 11 Governor. The chief administrative officer of the department
- 12 shall be the Commissioner of Corrections.
- 13 (2) * * * (* * * a) There shall be a Division of
- 14 Administration and Finance within the department, which shall have
- 15 as its chief administrative officer a Deputy Commissioner for
- 16 Administration and Finance who shall be appointed by the
- 17 commissioner, and shall be directly responsible to the
- 18 commissioner.
- 19 (* * *b) There shall be a Division of Community
- 20 Corrections within the department, which shall have as its chief
- 21 administrative officer a Deputy Commissioner for Community
- 22 Corrections, who shall be appointed by the commissioner, and shall
- 23 be directly responsible to the commissioner. The Probation and

- 24 Parole Board shall continue to exercise the authority as provided
- 25 by law, but after July 1, 1976, the Division of Community
- 26 Corrections shall serve as the administrative agency for the
- 27 Probation and Parole Board.
- 28 (* * *c) There shall be a Division of Workforce
- 29 Development within the department, which shall have as its chief
- 30 administrative officer a Deputy Commissioner for Workforce
- 31 Development, who shall be appointed by the commissioner, and shall
- 32 be directly responsible to the commissioner.
- 33 (3) The department shall succeed to the exclusive control of
- 34 all records, books, papers, equipment and supplies, and all lands,
- 35 buildings and other real and personal property now or hereafter
- 36 belonging to or assigned to the use and benefit or under the
- 37 control of the Mississippi State Penitentiary and the Mississippi
- 38 Probation and Parole Board, except the records of parole process
- 39 and revocation and legal matters related thereto, and shall have
- 40 the exercise and control of the use, distribution and disbursement
- 41 of all funds, appropriations and taxes now or hereafter in
- 42 possession, levied, collected or received or appropriated for the
- 43 use, benefit, support and maintenance of these two (2) agencies
- 44 except as otherwise provided by law, and the department shall have
- 45 general supervision of all the affairs of the two (2) agencies
- 46 herein named except as otherwise provided by law, and the care and
- 47 conduct of all buildings and grounds, business methods and
- 48 arrangements of accounts and records, the organization of the

- 49 administrative plans of each institution, and all other matters
- 50 incident to the proper functioning of the two (2) agencies.
- 51 (4) The commissioner may lease the lands for oil, gas,
- 52 mineral exploration and other purposes, and contract with other
- 53 state agencies for the proper management of lands under such
- 54 leases or for the provision of other services, and the proceeds
- 55 thereof shall be paid into the General Fund of the state.
- SECTION 2. Section 47-5-26, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 57 amended as follows:
- 58 47-5-26. (1) The commissioner shall employ the following
- 59 personnel:
- 60 (a) A Deputy Commissioner for Administration and
- 61 Finance, who shall supervise and implement all fiscal policies and
- 62 programs within the department, supervise and implement all hiring
- 63 and personnel matters within the department, supervise the
- 64 department's personnel director, supervise and implement all
- 65 purchasing within the department and supervise and implement all
- 66 data processing activities within the department, and who shall
- 67 serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Division of
- 68 Administration and Finance. He shall possess either:
- (i) A master's degree from an accredited four-year
- 70 college or university in public or business administration,
- 71 accounting, economics or a directly related field, and four (4)
- 72 years of experience in work related to the above-described duties,
- 73 one (1) year of which must have included line or functional
- 74 supervision; or

75 (ii) A bachelor's degree from an accredited 76 four-year college or university in public or business 77 administration, accounting, economics or a directly related field, 78 and six (6) years of experience in work related to the 79 above-described duties, one (1) year of which must have included 80 line or functional supervision. Certification by the State of Mississippi as a certified public accountant may be substituted 81 82 for one (1) year of the required experience. 83 A Deputy Commissioner for Community Corrections, 84 who shall initiate and administer programs, including, but not 85 limited to, supervision of probationers, parolees and suspensioners, counseling, community-based treatment, interstate 86 87 compact administration and enforcement, prevention programs, halfway houses and group homes, technical violation centers, 88 89 restitution centers, presentence investigations, and work and 90 educational releases, and shall serve as the Chief Executive 91 Officer of the Division of Community Services. The Deputy Commissioner for Community Corrections is charged with full and 92 complete cooperation with the State Parole Board and shall make 93 94 monthly reports to the Chairman of the Parole Board in the form 95 and type required by the chairman, in his discretion, for the 96 proper performance of the probation and parole functions. After a 97 plea or verdict of quilty to a felony is entered against a person 98 and before he is sentenced, the Deputy Commissioner for Community Corrections shall procure from any available source and shall file 99

in the presentence records any information regarding any criminal

101 history of the person such as fingerprints, dates of arrests, complaints, civil and criminal charges, investigative reports of 102 103 arresting and prosecuting agencies, reports of the National Crime 104 Information Center, the nature and character of each offense, 105 noting all particular circumstances thereof and any similar data 106 about the person. The Deputy Commissioner for Community 107 Corrections shall keep an accurate and complete duplicate record of this file and shall furnish the duplicate to the department. 108 109 This file shall be placed in and shall constitute a part of the inmate's master file. The Deputy Commissioner for Community 110 Corrections shall furnish this file to the State Parole Board when 111 112 the file is needed in the course of its official duties. He shall 113 possess either: (i) a master's degree in counseling, corrections psychology, guidance, social work, criminal justice or some 114 related field and at least four (4) years' full-time experience in 115 116 such field, including at least one (1) year of supervisory 117 experience; or (ii) a bachelor's degree in a field described in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph and at least six (6) years' 118 119 full-time work in corrections, one (1) year of which shall have

(c) A Deputy Commissioner for Institutions, who shall administer institutions, reception and diagnostic centers, prerelease centers and other facilities and programs provided therein, and shall serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Division of Institutions. He shall possess either: (i) a master's degree in counseling, criminal justice, psychology,

134 A Deputy Commissioner for Programs, Education and 135 Reentry, who shall initiate and administer programs, including but not limited to, education services, religious services, moral 136 137 rehabilitation, alcohol and drug rehabilitation, and court 138 The Deputy Commissioner for Programs, Education and 139 Reentry may coordinate with any educational institution to develop a program for moral rehabilitation with an emphasis on promoting 140 effective programs for release. The Deputy Commissioner for 141

Programs, Education and Reentry shall focus on reentry programs

143 aimed at reducing recidivism. The programs shall incorporate a

144 moral component focused on providing offenders with an opportunity

to make positive changes while incarcerated that will enable them

146 to be productive members of society upon their release. Such

147 deputy commissioner shall possess either:

(i) A master's degree in counseling, corrections,

149 psychology, guidance, social work, criminal justice or some

150 related field and at least four (4) years' full-time experience in

151 such field, including at least one (1) year of supervisory

152 experience; or

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153 (ii) A bachelor's degree in a field described in 154 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph and at least six (6) years 155 full-time work in corrections, one (1) year of which shall have

156 been at the supervisory level.

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- A Deputy Commissioner for Workforce Development who shall serve as the Chief Executive Officer of Prison Industries and Director of Prison Agricultural Enterprises. The Deputy Commissioner for Workforce Development shall work in collaboration with the Executive Director of the Office of Workforce Development to implement workforce development programs within the corrections system which align with the strategic plan for an integrated workforce development system for the state, as described in Section 37-153-7. Such deputy commissioner shall be a person with extensive experience in development of economic, human and physical resources, with an emphasis in the corrections or reentry environments preferred. The Deputy Commissioner for Workforce Development shall have at least a bachelor's degree from a state-accredited institution and no less than eight (8) years of professional experience related to workforce development. Deputy Commissioner for Workforce Development, with the assistance from the Office of Workforce Development, shall:
 - Inventory and measure the effectiveness of (i) current workforce development programs in the state corrections system, with the goal of eliminating any programs which do not result in desired outcomes, including, but not limited to, an increase in employment in reentering offenders, a better

- 179 environment within correctional facilities in the state, or a
- 180 reduction in recidivism;
- 181 (ii) Partner with educational institutions to
- 182 provide additional opportunities in workforce development programs
- 183 for offenders leading to high-wage, high-skill jobs upon reentry;
- 184 (iii) Provide information, as appropriate, to
- 185 offenders on workforce development programs available within the
- 186 corrections system;
- 187 (iv) Work with industry to identify barriers which
- 188 inhibit offender reentry and employment and evaluate the
- 189 responsiveness of the corrections system and other support
- 190 entities to the needs of industry;
- 191 (v) Develop short- and long-term goals for the
- 192 state related to workforce development and reentry offender
- 193 employment within the corrections system, and
- 194 (vi) Perform a comprehensive review of workforce
- 195 development in the corrections system, including the amount
- 196 expended on programs supported by state or federal money and their
- 197 outcomes.
- 198 * * *
- 199 (2) The commissioner shall employ an administrative
- 200 assistant for parole matters who shall be selected by the State
- 201 Parole Board who shall be an employee of the department assigned
- 202 to the State Parole Board and who shall be located at the office
- 203 of the State Parole Board, and who shall work under the quidance,
- 204 supervision and direction of the board.

- 205 (3) The administrative assistant for parole matters shall
- 206 receive an annual salary to be established by the Legislature.
- 207 The salaries of department employees not established by the
- 208 Legislature shall receive an annual salary established by the
- 209 State Personnel Board.
- 210 (4) The commissioner shall employ a superintendent for the
- 211 Parchman facility, Central Mississippi Correctional Facility and
- 212 South Mississippi Correctional Institution of the Department of
- 213 Corrections. The Superintendent of the Mississippi State
- 214 Penitentiary shall reside on the grounds of the Parchman facility.
- 215 Each superintendent shall appoint an officer in charge when he is
- 216 absent.
- 217 Each superintendent shall develop and implement a plan for
- 218 the prevention and control of an inmate riot and shall file a
- 219 report with the Chairman of the Senate Corrections Committee and
- 220 the Chairman of the House Penitentiary Committee on the first day
- 221 of each regular session of the Legislature regarding the status of
- 222 the plan.
- In order that the grievances and complaints of inmates,
- 224 employees and visitors at each facility may be heard in a timely
- 225 and orderly manner, each superintendent shall appoint or designate
- 226 an employee at the facility to hear grievances and complaints and
- 227 to report grievances and complaints to the superintendent. Each
- 228 superintendent shall institute procedures as are necessary to
- 229 provide confidentiality to those who file grievances and
- 230 complaints.

231	(5) For a one-year period beginning July 1, 2016, any person
232	authorized for employment under this section shall not be subject
233	to the rules, regulations and procedures of the State Personnel

234 Board, except as otherwise provided under Section 25-9-127(5).

235 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 236 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2024.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 47-5-8, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ELIMINATE THE POSITION OF EXECUTIVE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS; TO AMEND SECTION 47-5-26, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING SECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
