Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1192

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- SECTION 1. Section 37-161-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 29 amended as follows:
- 30 37-161-3. (1) The Legislature finds and declares the
- 31 following:
- 32 (a) Meeting the educational needs of children in our
- 33 state's schools is of the greatest importance to the future
- 34 welfare of the State of Mississippi;
- 35 (b) Closing the achievement gap between high-performing
- 36 students, including the achievement gap among at-risk students, is
- 37 a significant and present challenge;
- 38 (c) Providing a broader range of educational options to
- 39 parents and utilizing existing resources, along with technology,
- 40 may help students in the state improve their academic achievement;
- 41 and
- 42 (d) Many of the state's school districts currently lack
- 43 the capacity to provide other public school choices for students
- 44 whose schools are low performing.

- 45 (2) There is created the Mississippi Virtual Public School
- 46 Program, which is the responsibility of the State Department of
- 47 Education. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 48 Mississippi Virtual Public School established under this section
- 49 provides Mississippi families with an alternative choice to access
- 50 additional educational resources in an effort to improve academic
- 51 achievement. The Mississippi Virtual Public School must be
- 52 recognized as a public school and provide equitable treatment and
- 53 resources as are other public schools in the state. Private
- 54 providers, overseen by the State Department of Education, may be
- 55 selected by the State Board of Education to administer, manage or
- 56 operate virtual school programs in this state, including the total
- 57 operation of the Mississippi Virtual Public School Program. Any
- 58 private provider chosen to provide services under the provisions
- of this subsection shall be chosen through the Mississippi Online
- 60 Course Application Process.
- 61 (3) Nothing in this section may be interpreted as precluding
- 62 the use of computer- and Internet-based instruction for students
- 63 in a virtual or remote setting utilizing the Mississippi Virtual
- 64 Public School.
- 65 (4) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 66 have the meanings respectively ascribed unless the context clearly
- 67 requires otherwise:
- 68 (a) "Mississippi Virtual Public School" means a public
- 69 school in which the state uses technology in order to deliver

- 70 instruction to students via the Internet in a virtual or remote
- 71 setting.
- 72 (b) "Sponsor" means the public school district is
- 73 responsible for the academic process for each student, including,
- 74 but not limited to, enrollment, awarding of credit and monitoring
- 75 progress.
- 76 (5) (a) The State Board of Education shall establish the
- 77 Mississippi Virtual Public School beginning in school year
- 78 2006-2007.
- 79 (b) Students who enroll in the Mississippi Virtual
- 80 Public School may reside anywhere in the State of Mississippi.
- 81 (6) Subject to appropriation, the Mississippi Virtual Public
- 82 School shall provide to each student enrolled in the school all
- 83 necessary instructional materials. Subject to appropriation, the
- 84 sponsored school must ensure that each student is provided access
- 85 to the necessary technology, such as a computer and printer, and
- 86 to an Internet connection for schoolwork purposes.
- 87 (7) The Mississippi Department of Education shall have
- 88 approval authority for all coursework and policy of the
- 89 Mississippi Virtual Public School.
- 90 (8) Each teacher employed by or participating in the
- 91 delivery of instruction through the Mississippi Virtual Public
- 92 School must meet all qualifications for licensure in the State of
- 93 Mississippi.
- 94 (9) Any student who meets state residency requirements may
- 95 enroll in the Mississippi Virtual Public School.

96 (10) Enrollment in the Mississippi Virtual Public School 97 shall be free of charge to students. The costs associated with the operations of the virtual school must be shared by the State 98 99 Department of Education, subject to appropriation, and/or the 100 local school districts. Once the State Department of Education 101 appropriation and the local school district budgeted funds for 102 Mississippi Virtual Public School have been expended and students choose to enroll in online courses, the costs of the online 103 104 courses may be the responsibility of the students' parents or 105 quardians.

(11)The Mississippi Department of Education is directed to provide a report on the Mississippi Virtual Public School and recommendations related to the future role of virtual education in public schools to the Chairman of the Senate Education Committee and the Chairman of the House of Representatives Education Committee by October 1, 2024. The report shall include, but not be limited to, an update on the history, cost, usage and student achievement related to the current Mississippi Virtual Public School and other virtual education programs which may exist in school districts across the state. The report shall also include, but not be limited to, recommendations related to using virtual education tools, including tools provided by or used by other public schools districts in Mississippi and/or third party vendors, to address student achievement, access to courses and teacher shortages in public schools.

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- 121 <u>SECTION 2</u> This act shall be known and may be cited as the 122 "Mississippi Modified School Calendar Grant Program."
- 123 **SECTION 3.** The Mississippi Legislature finds the following:
- 124 (a) Whereas, a modified school calendar apportioning
- 125 required instructional days throughout the year can increase
- 126 student achievement and engagement and provide staff with a more
- 127 flexible schedule.
- 128 (b) Therefore, it is the intent of the Mississippi
- 129 Legislature to incentivize public school districts to maintain or
- 130 consider adopting a modified school calendar by offsetting costs
- 131 associated with adopting a modified school calendar through a
- 132 time-limited grant.
- 133 **SECTION 4.** For purposes of this act, the following words
- 134 shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context
- 135 requires otherwise:
- 136 (a) "Grant program" means the Mississippi Modified
- 137 School Calendar Grant Program established in this act.
- 138 (b) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 139 Education.
- 140 (c) "Modified school calendar" means a nontraditional
- 141 school calendar in which the length of summer break is shortened,
- 142 there are breaks dispersed throughout the school year, and
- 143 required instructional days are evenly distributed across the
- 144 calendar year.
- 145 (d) "School district" means all public school
- 146 districts.

- 147 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) There is established the Mississippi
 148 Modified School Calendar Grant Program which shall be administered
 149 by the department for the purpose of offsetting initial costs
 150 incurred by school districts which have implemented or intend to
- incurred by school districts which have implemented or intend to implement a modified school calendar.
- 152 (2) Subject to the provisions of this act and any other
 153 applicable state law and regulation, school districts receiving a
 154 grant shall have the authority to use the funds provided in this
 155 grant program in a way that best facilitates their plan to
 156 transition to and maintain a modified school calendar and maximize
- 158 **SECTION 6.** (1) The department shall:

student achievement and engagement.

- 159 (a) Inform all school districts about the grant 160 program;
- 161 (b) Develop regulations and procedures to govern the 162 administration of the grant program, including application 163 requirements, within two (2) months after enactment; and
- (c) Subject to appropriation, award school districts
 meeting the requirements of the program a grant for expenses
 related to the adoption or maintenance of a modified school
 calendar beginning in the 2024-2025 academic year. Initial grant
 awards shall be made by July 1, 2024, and July 1 of each year
 thereafter.
- 170 (2) The department shall administer this program with 171 existing personnel and resources and shall not contract for 172 external support.

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- 173 (3) An application for an award from the grant program shall
- 174 include:
- 175 (a) The rationale for adopting a modified school
- 176 calendar, including relevant short- and long-term goals of the
- 177 school district, which a modified calendar may help achieve;
- 178 (b) Evidence of community support and engagement to
- 179 move to a modified school calendar;
- 180 (c) A detailed budget of operating expenses expected to
- 181 be incurred as a result of adopting a modified calendar; and
- 182 (d) A detailed calendar, including plans for any
- 183 intercession activities.
- 184 (4) Grants awarded shall be used for expenses incurred as a
- 185 result of the adoption of a modified school calendar, including,
- 186 but not limited to:
- 187 (a) Transportation;
- 188 (b) Certified and noncertified staffing during
- 189 intercessions;
- 190 (c) Remediation and enrichment programs during
- 191 intercession; and
- 192 (d) Utilities.
- 193 **SECTION 7.** (1) School districts shall be eligible for a
- 194 maximum award of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00)
- 195 per year for a maximum of three (3) years.
- 196 (2) Eliqible school districts shall include those which
- 197 implement a modified school calendar by the beginning of the
- 198 2024-2025 academic year. Any school district which implemented a

- 199 modified school calendar in the 2021-2022, 2022-2023, 2023-2024 or 200 2024-2025 academic years shall also be eligible.
- 201 (3) The amount awarded each year shall be based on the
 202 actual budget and plan submitted by the school district, the
 203 number of students in the school district, and other factors which
 204 may increase the cost of delivery of services, including the rural
 205 nature of the school district.
- 206 (4) The amount of the award shall not exceed the actual
 207 budget submitted by the school district related to modified school
 208 calendar costs.
- 209 (5) Grants received by school districts under this chapter 210 shall not be used to purchase land, construct new facilities or to 211 finance or satisfy any existing debt.
- 212 SECTION 8. There is created a special fund in the State Treasury, to be known as the "Mississippi Modified School Calendar 213 214 Grant Fund," from which the grants authorized by this act shall be 215 disbursed by the department. The fund shall be maintained by the 216 State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart 217 from the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining 218 in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund 219 and shall not lapse into the State General Fund. Any interest 220 earned or investment earnings or interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. 221
- 222 <u>SECTION 9.</u> The department shall provide a comprehensive 223 report on the use of funds distributed under this grant program 224 and the effectiveness of modified calendar school districts to the H. B. 1192

- 225 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House of
- 226 Representatives, and Chairs of the Senate and House Appropriations
- 227 and Education Committees by October 1, 2024, and October 1 of each
- 228 year thereafter.
- 229 **SECTION 10.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 230 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-161-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE A REPORT ON THE MISSISSIPPI VIRTUAL PUBLIC SCHOOL AND RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO 4 THE FUTURE ROLE OF VIRTUAL EDUCATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO THE 5 CHAIRMEN OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES EDUCATION COMMITTEES BY OCTOBER 1, 2024; TO ESTABLISH THE MISSISSIPPI 7 MODIFIED SCHOOL CALENDAR GRANT PROGRAM TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE 8 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF INCENTIVIZING PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO MAINTAIN OR CONSIDER ADOPTING A MODIFIED 9 SCHOOL CALENDAR BY OFFSETTING COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH ADOPTING A 10 11 MODIFIED SCHOOL CALENDAR THROUGH A TIME-LIMITED GRANT; TO REQUIRE 12 THE DEPARTMENT TO DEVELOP REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES TO GOVERN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE GRANT PROGRAM, INCLUDING APPLICATION 13 REQUIREMENTS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA; TO PROVIDE 14 15 THAT GRANTS AWARDED SHALL BE USED FOR EXPENSES INCURRED AS A 16 RESULT OF THE ADOPTION OF A MODIFIED SCHOOL CALENDAR; TO PROVIDE 17 THAT SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR A MAXIMUM AWARD OF 18 \$250,000.00 PER YEAR FOR A MAXIMUM OF THREE YEARS; TO CREATE A 19 SPECIAL FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY, TO BE KNOWN AS THE "MISSISSIPPI MODIFIED SCHOOL CALENDAR GRANT FUND"; TO REQUIRE THE 20 DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE A COMPREHENSIVE REPORT ON THE USE OF FUNDS 21 22 DISTRIBUTED UNDER THIS GRANT PROGRAM TO THE GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND CHAIRS OF 23 THE SENATE AND HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS AND EDUCATION COMMITTEES BY 24 OCTOBER 1, 2024, AND OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR THEREAFTER; AND FOR 25 26 RELATED PURPOSES.
