Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1379

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 19 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 20 "Students Safe at School Act."
- 21 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) There is created the Mississippi School
- 22 Safety Task Force (hereinafter referred to as the "Task Force")
- 23 for the purpose of the continual study of ensuring and enhancing
- 24 safe school environments for students, teachers and staff in
- 25 Mississippi and to advise and assist the department in the
- 26 implementation of best practices for prevention of and response to
- 27 any type of emergency or other situation threatening the safety of
- 28 students or school personnel or the property of local school
- 29 districts.
- 30 (2) The Task Force shall be composed of the following
- 31 thirteen (13) members:
- 32 (a) The State Superintendent of Public Education, who
- 33 shall serve as the chairman;

- 34 (b) The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of
- 35 Public Safety or his or her designee, who shall serve as a vice
- 36 chairman;
- 37 (c) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 38 Department of Mental Health or his or her designee, who shall
- 39 serve as a vice chairman;
- 40 (d) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency
- 41 Management Agency or his or her designee;
- 42 (e) The Director of the Mississippi Office of Homeland
- 43 Security or his or her designee;
- 44 (f) The Director of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics
- 45 or his or her designee;
- 46 (g) The Director of the Mississippi Highway Patrol or
- 47 his or her designee;
- 48 (h) A representative of the Mississippi Association of
- 49 School Superintendents;
- 50 (i) A representative of the Mississippi School
- 51 Administrators Association;
- 52 (j) A representative of the Mississippi Association of
- 53 School Resource Officers;
- 54 (k) A representative of the Mississippi Sheriffs'
- 55 Association;
- 56 (1) A representative of the Mississippi Association of
- 57 Chiefs of Police;
- 58 (m) An individual who provides security and safety
- 59 services to a school district.

- 60 (3) The Task Force shall hold its first meeting within sixty
- 61 (60) days of the effective date of this act, on a call of the
- 62 chairman of the Task Force. A majority of the membership of the
- 63 Task Force shall constitute a quorum and shall meet at the call of
- 64 the chairman or one (1) of the vice chairmen if the chairmanship
- 65 is vacant or if the chairman is unable to serve. All members must
- 66 be notified in writing of all meetings at least five (5) business
- 67 days before the date that a meeting of the Task Force is
- 68 scheduled.
- 69 (4) The Task Force shall report its findings and
- 70 recommendations to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the
- 71 Speaker of the House and the Chairmen of the Education Committees
- 72 of the Legislature annually not later than December 1 each year.
- 73 **SECTION 3.** Section 37-11-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 74 brought forward as follows:
- 75 37-11-5. (1) It shall be the duty of the principals and
- 76 teachers in all public school buildings to instruct the pupils in
- 77 the methods of fire drills and to practice fire drills until all
- 78 the pupils in the school are familiar with the methods of escape.
- 79 Such fire drills shall be conducted often enough to keep such
- 80 pupils well drilled. It shall be the further duty of such
- 81 principals and teachers to instruct the pupils in all programs of
- 82 emergency management as may be designated by the State Department
- 83 of Education.
- 84 (2) It shall be the further duty of such principals and
- 85 teachers to develop and conduct an active shooter drill within the

- 86 first sixty (60) days of each new school semester for students,
- 87 teachers and staff.
- 88 **SECTION 4.** (1) In consultation with the School Safety Task
- 89 Force, the Mississippi Department of Education shall develop
- 90 policies and/or procedures to implement the "Mississippi
- 91 Behavioral Threat Assessment Management System" (MBTAMS) to ensure
- 92 compliance within each local school district in the State of
- 93 Mississippi.
- 94 (2) There is created within the Office of the Attorney
- 95 General, the School Emergency Response Mapping Data Grant Program,
- 96 for the purpose of establishing a single, verified source of
- 97 mapping data for each school in the State of Mississippi that is
- 98 standardized, accurate and accessible to public safety agencies
- 99 and which ensures efficient responses to any emergency on a school
- 100 campus. Each school district, charter school governing board and
- 101 governing board of each private K-12 school, in consultation with
- 102 local law enforcement agencies having appropriate jurisdiction in
- 103 the county or municipality wherein the school district is located,
- 104 may apply to receive funds from the program to provide school
- 105 mapping data for each public, charter and private school in that
- 106 county or municipality. The Attorney General may promulgate rules
- 107 and regulations necessary to effectuate the provisions of this
- 108 subsection.
- 109 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 110 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2024.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL SAFETY TASK FORCE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE, TO PROVIDE THAT THE TASK FORCE SHALL CONTINUALLY STUDY ACTIONS THAT MAY BE TAKEN TO ENHANCE SAFE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTS FOR STUDENTS, 5 TEACHERS AND STAFF IN MISSISSIPPI, AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF BEST PRACTICES FOR PREVENTION AND RESPONSE; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND ANY RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE ON AN ANNUAL BASIS; TO CREATE "THE STUDENTS SAFE AT SCHOOL ACT"; 9 TO CREATE THE SCHOOL EMERGENCY RESPONSE MAPPING DATA GRANT 10 PROGRAM, WITHIN THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A SOURCE OF MAPPING DATA FOR EACH SCHOOL IN THE STATE 11 12 TO ENSURE EFFICIENT RESPONSES TO ANY EMERGENCY ON A SCHOOL CAMPUS; 13 TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 14 DEVELOP POLICIES AND PROCEDURES TO IMPLEMENT THE MISSISSIPPI 15 BEHAVIORAL THREAT ASSESSMENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 37-11-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR THE PURPOSE OF 16 17 POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
