AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General

23 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 24 25 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 26 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 27 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal 28 29 services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall 30 publish. In accordance with applicable laws, if an agency 31 determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the 32 agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to 33 the personal services amount must be approved by the State 34 Personnel Director and the State Fiscal Officer after consultation 35 with the Legislative Budget Office. Any adjustment shall be reported to the Legislative Budget Office and the House and Senate 36 37 Appropriations Chairmen. The agency's personal services 38 appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may not be utilized for active 39 40 Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. It shall be the agency's 41 responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are 42 used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, 43 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. If the State Personnel Board 44 45 determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board 46 47 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in

- 48 the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the
- 49 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the
- 50 Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the
- 51 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel
- 52 Board.
- 53 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 54 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 55 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 56 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do
- 57 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 58 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the
- 59 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 60 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 61 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 63 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 64 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 65 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 66 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 67 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 68 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 69 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 70 appropriated level.
- 71 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 72 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for

- 73 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 74 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 76 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 77 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 78 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 79 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 80 Mississippi Department of Insurance shall maintain complete
- 81 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 82 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- 83 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
- 84 Year 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
- 85 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be
- 86 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 87 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 88 provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.
- SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 90 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 91 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 92 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 93 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
- 94 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
- 95 performance measures provided below:

- 125 Section 1, funds in the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars
- 126 (\$20,000.00) is provided and shall be expended to pay the annual
- 127 dues for the National Conference of Insurance Legislators.
- 128 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- 129 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members
- 130 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate
- 131 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony
- 132 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public
- 133 announcement or ceremony regarding any project for which the
- 134 Legislature has made funds available. Any signage regarding any
- 135 public event or project shall include the following language:
- 136 "Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi
- 137 State Legislature."
- 138 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 139 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 140 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 141 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 142 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 143 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 144 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 145 made without competitive bids.
- 146 **SECTION 10.** Within the limits of the funds available to the
- 147 Mississippi Insurance Department for such purpose, the
- 148 Commissioner of Insurance for the Mississippi Insurance Department
- 149 may grant a paid internship to students pursuing junior or senior

undergraduate level year coursework toward a bachelor's degree in risk management insurance or graduate level coursework towards a master's degree in business administration. Those applicants deemed qualified by the Mississippi Department of Insurance shall receive funds that may be used to pay for tuition, books and related fees to pursue their degree. It is the intent of the Legislature that the paid internship program shall be used as

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two
Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for the
State Fire Marshal's Office for fire safety prevention and
services, including, but not limited to, fire protection supplies
and materials, smoke alarms, and public service announcements
providing fire prevention information.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Propane Education and Research Program Fund, for the purpose of research and development of more cost effective uses of propane and on educational programs, safety programs, and market development of propane for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025......\$ 130,000.00.

SECTION 13. Of the funds provided in Section 2, Three
Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) is provided from the Mississippi
Volunteer Firefighter Length-of-Service Awards Program Fund.

- 191 Fund which was created in Section 17-23-1 (4), Mississippi Code of
- 192 1972 to the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the Rural Fire
- 193 Truck Matching Assistance Program for the fiscal year beginning
- 194 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 2,000,000.00.
- 195 **SECTION 16.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 196 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 197 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 198 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 199 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 200 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

201 **SECTION 17.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 202 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2024.
