## Pending COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill No. 822

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 9-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 9-12-1. (1) (a) From and after January 1, 2024, there
- 12 shall be created one (1) inferior court as authorized by Article
- 13 6, Section 172 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to be
- 14 located within the boundaries established in Section 29-5-203 for
- 15 the Capitol Complex Improvement District, hereinafter referred to
- 16 as "CCID". The CCID inferior court shall have jurisdiction to
- 17 hear and determine all preliminary matters and criminal matters
- 18 authorized by law for municipal courts that accrue or occur, in



- 19 whole or in part, within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex
- 20 Improvement District; and shall have the same jurisdiction as
- 21 municipal courts to hear and determine all cases charging
- 22 violations of the motor vehicle and traffic laws of this state,
- and violations of the City of Jackson's traffic ordinance or 23
- 24 ordinances related to the disturbance of the public peace that
- accrue or occur, in whole or in part, within the boundaries of the 25
- 26 Capitol Complex Improvement District. Appeals from the CCID
- 27 inferior court shall be governed in the same manner as prescribed
- 28 by law for appeals from municipal courts described in Section
- 29 11-51-81 and certiorari review as described in Section 11-51-95.
- 30 Any person convicted in the CCID inferior court may (b)
- 31 be placed in the custody of the Mississippi Department of
- 32 Corrections, Central Mississippi facility.
- The Chief Justice of the Mississippi Supreme Court \* \* \* 33
- 34 may appoint up to two (2) judges to serve the CCID inferior
- 35 court \* \* \*. The judges shall possess all qualifications required
- by law for municipal court judges. Such judges shall be \* \* \* 36
- 37 qualified electors of this state, and shall have such other
- 38 qualifications as provided by law for municipal judges.
- 39 The Administrative Office of Courts shall provide
- 40 compensation for the CCID inferior court judges and \* \* \* their
- support staff \* \* \*. \* \* The compensation of each judge 41
- 42 shall \* \* \* be in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- (\$10,000.00) less than the salary authorized by law for county 43

- 44 judges. Any CCID judge who receives an annual salary of
- 45 Thirty-six Thousand Dollars (\$36,000.00) or more shall be a
- 46 full-time judge, and shall not otherwise engage in the practice of
- 47 law.
- 48 (4) All fines, penalties, fees and costs imposed and
- 49 collected by the CCID inferior court shall be deposited with the
- 50 City of Jackson municipal treasurer or equivalent officer.

- 52 **SECTION 2.** Section 9-7-26, Mississippi Code of 1972, which
- 53 authorizes the appointment of four (4) temporary special circuit
- 54 judges for the Seventh Circuit Court District, shall stand
- 55 repealed.
- 56 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 57 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-12-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY APPEALS FROM THE CCID INTERIOR COURT; TO AUTHORIZE TWO
- 3 JUDGES FOR THE CCID INFERIOR COURT AND CLARIFY COMPENSATION FOR
- 4 THE JUDGES; TO DELETE THE AUTOMATIC REPEALER ON THIS SECTION; TO
- 5 REPEAL SECTION 9-7-26, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH AUTHORIZES
- 6 THE APPOINTMENT OF CIRCUIT JUDGES FOR THE SEVENTH CIRCUIT COURT
- 7 DISTRICT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
