Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill No. 1192

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 8 SECTION 1. Section 37-161-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 37-161-3. (1) The Legislature finds and declares the
- 11 following:
- 12 (a) Meeting the educational needs of children in our
- 13 state's schools is of the greatest importance to the future
- 14 welfare of the State of Mississippi;
- 15 (b) Closing the achievement gap between high-performing
- 16 students, including the achievement gap among at-risk students, is
- 17 a significant and present challenge;



- 18 (c) Providing a broader range of educational options to
- 19 parents and utilizing existing resources, along with technology,
- 20 may help students in the state improve their academic achievement;
- 21 and
- 22 (d) Many of the state's school districts currently lack
- 23 the capacity to provide other public school choices for students
- 24 whose schools are low performing.
- 25 (2) There is created the Mississippi Virtual Public School
- 26 Program, which is the responsibility of the State Department of
- 27 Education. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 28 Mississippi Virtual Public School established under this section
- 29 provides Mississippi families with an alternative choice to access
- 30 additional educational resources in an effort to improve academic
- 31 achievement. The Mississippi Virtual Public School must be
- 32 recognized as a public school and provide equitable treatment and
- 33 resources as are other public schools in the state. Private
- 34 providers, overseen by the State Department of Education, may be
- 35 selected by the State Board of Education to administer, manage or
- 36 operate virtual school programs in this state, including the total
- 37 operation of the Mississippi Virtual Public School Program. Any
- 38 private provider chosen to provide services under the provisions
- 39 of this subsection shall be chosen through the Mississippi Online
- 40 Course Application Process.
- 41 (3) Nothing in this section may be interpreted as precluding
- 42 the use of computer- and Internet-based instruction for students

- 43 in a virtual or remote setting utilizing the Mississippi Virtual
- 44 Public School.
- 45 (4) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 46 have the meanings respectively ascribed unless the context clearly
- 47 requires otherwise:
- 48 (a) "Mississippi Virtual Public School" means a public
- 49 school in which the state uses technology in order to deliver
- 50 instruction to students via the Internet in a virtual or remote
- 51 setting.
- 52 (b) "Sponsor" means the public school district is
- 53 responsible for the academic process for each student, including,
- 54 but not limited to, enrollment, awarding of credit and monitoring
- 55 progress.
- 56 (5) (a) The State Board of Education shall establish the
- 57 Mississippi Virtual Public School beginning in school year
- 58 2006-2007.
- 59 (b) Students who enroll in the Mississippi Virtual
- 60 Public School may reside anywhere in the State of Mississippi.
- 61 (6) Subject to appropriation, the Mississippi Virtual Public
- 62 School shall provide to each student enrolled in the school all
- 63 necessary instructional materials. Subject to appropriation, the
- 64 sponsored school must ensure that each student is provided access
- 65 to the necessary technology, such as a computer and printer, and
- 66 to an Internet connection for schoolwork purposes.



- 67 (7) The Mississippi Department of Education shall have
- 68 approval authority for all coursework and policy of the
- 69 Mississippi Virtual Public School.
- 70 (8) Each teacher employed by or participating in the
- 71 delivery of instruction through the Mississippi Virtual Public
- 72 School must meet all qualifications for licensure in the State of
- 73 Mississippi.
- 74 (9) Any student who meets state residency requirements may
- 75 enroll in the Mississippi Virtual Public School.
- 76 (10) Enrollment in the Mississippi Virtual Public School
- 77 shall be free of charge to students. The costs associated with
- 78 the operations of the virtual school must be shared by the State
- 79 Department of Education, subject to appropriation, and/or the
- 80 local school districts. Once the State Department of Education
- 81 appropriation and the local school district budgeted funds for
- 82 Mississippi Virtual Public School have been expended and students
- 83 choose to enroll in online courses, the costs of the online
- 84 courses may be the responsibility of the students' parents or
- 85 quardians.
- 86 (11) The Mississippi Department of Education is directed to
- 87 provide a report on the Mississippi Virtual Public School and
- 88 recommendations related to the future role of virtual education in
- 89 public schools to the Chairman of the Senate Education Committee
- 90 and the Chairman of the House of Representatives Education
- 91 Committee by October 1, 2024. The report shall include, but not

- 92 be limited to, an update on the history, cost, usage and student
- 93 achievement related to the current Mississippi Virtual Public
- 94 School and other virtual education programs which may exist in
- 95 school districts across the state. The report shall also include,
- 96 but not be limited to, recommendations related to using virtual
- 97 education tools, including tools provided by or used by other
- 98 public schools districts in Mississippi and/or third party
- 99 vendors, to address student achievement, access to courses and
- 100 teacher shortages in public schools.
- 101 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 102 and after July 1, 2024.
