Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

L1	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L2	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
L3	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Public Service
L 4	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by

15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the purpose of
16	defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025

19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
20	Section 1 and Section 2, the following positions are authorized:
21	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
22	Permanent: 51
23	Time-Limited: 5
24	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
26	Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds
27	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
28	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi
29	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal
30	services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall
31	publish. In accordance with applicable laws, if an agency
32	determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the
33	agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to
34	the personal services amount must be approved by the State
35	Personnel Director and the State Fiscal Officer after consultation
36	with the Legislative Budget Office. Any adjustment shall be
37	reported to the Legislative Budget Office and the House and Senate
38	Appropriations Chairmen. The agency's personal services
39	appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved

- 40 vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may not be utilized for active
- 41 Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. It shall be the agency's
- 42 responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are
- 43 used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes,
- 44 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 45 salaries for current employees. If the State Personnel Board
- 46 determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any
- 47 of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board
- 48 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in
- 49 the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the
- 50 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the
- 51 Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the
- 52 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel
- 53 Board.
- Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 55 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 56 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 57 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do
- 58 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 59 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the
- 60 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 61 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 62 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 64 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or

65	allowable	under	the	terms	set	forth	within	this	act.	The	State

66 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written

67 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The

Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 68

69 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

70 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the

71 appropriated level.

72 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 73 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 74 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are

75 withdrawn and no longer available.

76 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 77 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A 78 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor. 79

SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

135	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that	the
136	Public Service Commission shall maintain complete accounting a	and
137	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds	
138	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in	the
139	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year	

- 140 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 141 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to
- 142 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 143 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 144 during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.
- 145 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 146 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 147 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 148 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 149 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 150 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 151 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 152 made without competitive bids.
- 153 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 154 Public Service Commission shall compile the amount of time that is
- 155 expended on each regulated entity during Fiscal Year 2024. On or
- 156 before August 1, 2024, the Public Service Commission shall report
- 157 these findings to the House of Representatives' Public Utilities
- 158 Committee, the Senate's Energy Committee, and the Legislative
- 159 Budget Office.
- 160 **SECTION 9.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 161 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 162 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 163 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal



- 164 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 165
- 166 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 167 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2024.
