section 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
this act, the following positions are authorized:

24 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 25 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 26 27 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 28 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 29 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal 30 services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall 31 publish. In accordance with applicable laws, if an agency determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the 32 33 agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to 34 the personal services amount must be approved by the State 35 Personnel Director and the State Fiscal Officer after consultation 36 with the Legislative Budget Office. Any adjustment shall be reported to the Legislative Budget Office and the House and Senate 37 38 Appropriations Chairmen. The agency's personal services appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved 39

40 vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may not be utilized for active 41 Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are 42 used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, 43 44 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing 45 salaries for current employees. If the State Personnel Board determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any 46 47 of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board 48 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in 49 the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the 50 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the 51 52 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel 53 Board.

54 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 55 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 56 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 57 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do 58 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If 59 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the 60 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 61 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 62 essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

80 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 81 Mississippi Arts Commission shall maintain complete accounting and 82 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 83 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 84 85 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 86 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to 87 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 88 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process. 89

90 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 91 Section 2, funds in the amount of One Million Four Hundred Ninety 92 Thousand Dollars (\$1,490,000.00) shall be derived from the 93 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the following: 94 95 Training of educators and promotion of arts programs in 100,000.00 96 public schools.....\$ 97 Miscellaneous grants and programs.....\$ 350,000.00 98 Whole Schools Initiative.....\$ 1,040,000.00 99 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 100 Arts Commission shall have the authority to transfer dollars 101 appropriated herein designated for the "Challenge Program," 102 specific amounts to a special fund in the State Treasury called 103 the Arts Commission Challenge Initiative Fund. The unexpended 104 amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall 105 not lapse into the State General Fund and may be expended by the 106 commission in subsequent fiscal years upon appropriation of the 107 Legislature. Any interest earned on the fund shall be deposited 108 to the credit of the fund and may be disbursed by the commission 109 upon appropriations of the Legislature. It is the intention of 110 the Legislature that the commission may award grants to arts 111 organizations from monies in the fund and the grantees will be required to provide matching funds for the grants in an amount of 112 113 not less than two (2) times the amount of the grant.

114 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that 115 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 116 117 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 118 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 119 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 120 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 121 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Arts Commission may retain an amount not to exceed one percent (1%) of the monies in the Building Fund for the Arts for the purpose of defraying administrative costs associated with administering the grant program established in Section 39-11-13, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Arts Commission for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Capital

Expense Funds, as authorized in HB 1611, 2023 Regular Session to provide for the funding of the Building Fund for the Arts Initiative for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 3,100,000.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, the amount that may be expended under the authority of this section, shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2024, from the amount authorized for the previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

149 **SECTION 11.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 150 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 151 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 152 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 153 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 154 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 155 SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2024. 156
