## HOUSE BILL NO. 22

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCLUDE PERSONS WHO HAVE VISION 20/200 OR LESS IN AT LEAST ONE
- 3 EYE WITH PROPER CORRECTION WITHIN THE DESCRIPTION OF PERSONS WITH
- DISABILITIES WHICH LIMIT OR IMPAIR THE ABILITY TO WALK FOR
- 5 PURPOSES OF BEING ELIGIBLE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL MOTOR
- 6 VEHICLE LICENSE PLATES OR TAGS, DECALS AND WINDSHIELD PLACARDS FOR 7 THE DISABLED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 27-19-56. (1) (a) Upon application by any legal resident
- of the State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or 12
- 13 impairs the ability to walk, or by the owner of a motor vehicle
- who has a child, parent or spouse with a disability which limits 14
- 15 or impairs the ability to walk and the child, parent or spouse is
- 16 living with the applicant, the Department of Revenue shall prepare
- 17 and issue through the county tax collectors a special license
- 18 plate bearing the International Symbol of Access adopted by
- Rehabilitation International in 1969 at its Eleventh World 19
- 20 Congress on Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than two

- 53 Department of Revenue shall prepare and issue through the county
- 54 tax collectors a special decal bearing the International Symbol of
- 55 Access adopted by Rehabilitation International in 1969 at its
- 56 Eleventh World Congress on Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not
- 57 more than two (2) vehicles that are registered in the applicant's
- 58 name and properly display the plate or tag issued under Section
- 59 27-19-53. The decal shall be affixed to the plate or tag issued

- 83 (c) Upon application by any legal resident of the State
- 84 of Mississippi who has a license tag issued under Section
- 85 27-19-56.14 properly displayed on his vehicle and has a disability
- 86 which limits or impairs the ability to walk or has a child, parent
- 87 or spouse with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to
- 88 walk and the child, parent or spouse is living with the applicant,
- 89 the Department of Revenue shall prepare and issue through the
- 90 county tax collectors a special decal bearing the International
- 91 Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation International in 1969
- 92 at its Eleventh World Congress on Rehabilitation of the Disabled
- 93 for not more than two (2) vehicles that are registered in the
- 94 applicant's name and properly display a tag issued under Section
- 95 27-19-56.14. The decal shall be affixed to the tag issued under

97 by the certification of a licensed physician that (i) the applicant or the applicant's child, parent or spouse meets the 98 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 99 100 ability to walk; and (ii) that the physician has determined that 101 the applicant or the applicant's child, parent or spouse will have 102 the disability for at least five (5) years. The special decal is 103 valid for the period of time that the license tag attached upon a 104 motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 27-19-56.14. A person to whom the special decal is issued may retain the decal and may 105 106 renew it by submitting to the county tax collector, on or before 107 its expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the 108 physician has determined (i) that the applicant or the applicant's 109 child, parent or spouse meets the definition of a person with a 110 disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk; and (ii) 111 that the applicant or the applicant's child, parent or spouse will 112 have the disability for at least five (5) years. If an applicant fails to renew the special decal before its date of expiration, 113 114 then he shall surrender the decal to the county tax collector. 115 The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as (d) (i) 116 used in this section, include motorcycles. 117 The term "persons with disabilities which (ii)

limit or impair the ability to walk" when used in this section

means those persons who, as determined by a licensed physician:

120	1. Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without
121	stopping to rest; or
122	2. Cannot walk without the use of, or
123	assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic
124	device, wheelchair, or other assistive device; or
125	3. Are restricted by lung disease to such an
126	extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume
127	for one (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one
128	(1) liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60)
129	mm/hg on room air at rest; or
130	4. Use portable oxygen; or
131	5. Have a cardiac condition to the extent
132	that the person's functional limitations are classified in
133	severity as Class III or Class IV according to standards set by
134	the American Heart Association; * * *
135	6. Are severely limited in their ability to
136	walk due to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition; or
137	7. Have vision 20/200 or less in at least one
138	(1) eye with proper correction.
139	For the purposes of certification relating to the condition
140	described in item 7 of this subparagraph (ii), an optometrist
141	licensed under Section 73-19-1 et seq., shall also be considered
142	to be a licensed physician.
143	(e) An applicant for a special license plate or decal

bearing the International Symbol of Access shall not be required

to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate or decal separate from or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

(2) The Department of Revenue shall prepare removable windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk, or upon the applications of owners of motor vehicles who have a child, parent or spouse with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk and the child, parent or spouse is living with the owner of the motor vehicle. The placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. The initial application shall be accompanied by the certification of a licensed physician that the applicant or the applicant's child, parent or spouse meets the definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to These placards shall be valid for the period of time that walk. the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 27-19-31(1) and may be renewed in the same manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates or decals under subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle.

170 The Department of Revenue shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles.

172 The Department of Revenue shall provide for the issuance of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application 173 174 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability 175 to walk, or upon the application of the owner of a motor vehicle who has a child, parent or spouse with a disability which limits 176 177 or impairs the ability to walk and the child, parent or spouse is 178 living with the owner of the motor vehicle. Temporary removable 179 windshield placards authorized by this subsection shall be 180 prepared by the Department of Revenue and shall be issued, free of 181 charge, to applicants through the offices of the tax collectors of 182 the counties. Application for a temporary removable windshield 183 placard must be accompanied by the certification of a licensed 184 physician that the applicant or the applicant's child, parent or 185 spouse meets the definition of persons with disabilities which 186 limit or impair the ability to walk. The certification shall also 187 include the period of time that the physician determines the 188 applicant or the applicant's child, parent or spouse will have the 189 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 190 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the 191 vehicle dashboard or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the 192 The temporary removable windshield placard shall be 193 valid for a period of time for which the physician has determined that the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six (6) 194

- 195 months from the date of issuance. The Department of Revenue shall 196 prescribe the placement for motorcycles.
- 197 The removable windshield placard and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include: 198
- 199 The International Symbol of Access, which is at (a) 200 least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the 201 color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue 202 shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be 203 white on a red shield);
- An identification number and, on the reverse side, 204 (b) 205 the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;
- 206 A date of expiration; and (C)
- 207 The seal of the State of Mississippi. (d)
- 208 (5) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an (a) 209 area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle 210 does not (i) have displayed the removable windshield placard 211 authorized in this section with the date of expiration visible, 212 (ii) have the special license plate issued under this section 213 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, (iii) have the disabled 214 American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 27-19-53 215 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, (iv) have the disabled 216 Purple Heart Medal recipient tag or plate issued under Section
- 27-19-56.5 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, (v) have the 217
- 218 disabled Bronze Star recipient tag or plate issued under Section
- 27-19-56.62 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, or (vi) 219

220 have a license tag issued under Section 27-19-56.14 and bearing 221 the special decal issued under subsection (1)(c) of this section 222 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle. Any person who 223 unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such areas, or who blocks such 224 spaces or access thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, 225 upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred 226 Dollars (\$200.00) for each such violation. For the third and 227 subsequent offenses under this section, the offender's driver's 228 license shall be suspended for ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public Safety in accordance with Section 63-1-53 229 in addition to any fine imposed. The court shall not suspend or 230 231 reduce any fine required to be imposed under this subsection. 232 A person who is charged with a violation of this 233 section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for 234 persons who are disabled and failing properly to display (i) a 235 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle or by 236 hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle, (ii) a special 237 license plate issued under this section upon the vehicle, (iii) a 238 disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 239 27-19-53, (iv) have the disabled Purple Heart Medal recipient tag 240 or plate issued under Section 27-19-56.5 properly displayed upon 241 the motor vehicle, (v) have the disabled Bronze Star recipient tag 242 or plate issued under Section 27-19-56.62 properly displayed upon 243 the motor vehicle, or (vi) a license tag issued under Section 27-19-56.14 and bearing the special decal issued under subsection 244

- 245 (1)(c) of this section properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, shall not be convicted and shall have the charge dismissed upon 246 247 presentation to the court of proof by means of sworn oral testimony or sworn affidavit that at the time of the charged 248 249 violation such person or a passenger in the vehicle possessed a 250 valid removable windshield placard issued under this section.
- 251 Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special 252 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with 253 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the 254 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained, 255 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be 256 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
  - **(7)** All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce such designated parking on private property. Any owner of private property may tow away a vehicle that is parked on the owner's private property in violation of the disabled parking restrictions set forth in this section at the vehicle owner's expense. addition, the vehicle owner may be subject to any fines or other penalties provided in this section. Only areas marked in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces shall bear the International Symbol of Access.

- 270 Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 271 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit 272 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 273 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 274 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges 275 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, 276 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and 277 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.
- 278 (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
  279 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
  280 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
  281 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.
  282 The identification required to park in such an area, except as
  283 provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:
  - (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard must be displayed or the vehicle must have a special license tag issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed or the vehicle must have a license tag issued under Section 27-19-56.14 and bearing the special decal issued under subsection (1) (c) of this section properly displayed.
- 291 (b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a
  292 temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,
  293 or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary
  294 windshield placard must be displayed.

- 298 (10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or other institution that transports disabled persons, the Department 299 300 of Revenue may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant 301 to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is 302 registered in the applicant's name that is used to transport 303 disabled residents of the institution. Such institution shall 304 comply with all other laws regarding the registration of such 305 vehicle.
- 306 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 307 and after July 1, 2025.
