HOUSE BILL NO. 610

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-55-71, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO DEFINE THE TERMS "NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION (NEMT)" AND "NON-AMBULATORY NEMT TRANSPORTATION SERVICE" AS USED IN THE STATUTE REQUIRING VEHICLE PERMITS AND ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR 5 NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 41-55-71, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 9
- 10 41-55-71. (1) As used in this section, the following terms shall be defined as provided in this subsection: 11
- 12 "Department" means the State Department of Health.
- 13 (b) "Nonemergency medical transportation" or "NEMT"
- means transportation services provided to an individual who is not 14
- 15 experiencing an emergency or in need of an ambulance but does have
- a transportation need related to a covered health benefit. These 16
- 17 services may be provided through regular means of transportation
- 18 or through specialized transportation capable of accommodating
- 19 wheelchairs, stretchers or other special equipment needs.

20	(c) "Nonemergency medical transportation provider" or
21	"NEMT provider" means any company in the business of providing
22	NEMT transportation services for compensation and any person,
23	group of persons or entity that provides NEMT transportation
24	services for compensation. Any company with a current
25	accreditation from the Nonemergency Medical Transportation
26	Accreditation Commission (NEMTAC) is deemed to be * * * an NEMT
27	provider.
28	(* * * \underline{d}) "Non-ambulatory NEMT transportation service"
29	means motor vehicle transportation provided on a regular basis by
30	a public or private entity or person that is designed exclusively
31	or primarily to serve the specific needs of individuals who
32	are * * * physically or mentally unable to use regular means of
33	transportation but do not require ambulance service. This
34	term * * * <u>includes</u> nonemergency medical transportation services
35	that are provided for Medicaid beneficiaries who are
36	non-ambulatory under the Medicaid nonemergency transportation
37	program or by managed care providers that have contracted with the
38	Division of Medicaid, except for those that are exempt from the
39	permitting requirement of this section under subsection (8).
40	(2) The <u>State Department of Health (department)</u> shall adopt
41	rules providing for applications for permits, issuance of permits,
42	renewal of permits and revocation of permits for vehicles used to
43	provide non-ambulatory NEMT services, and the department may

- 46 (3) The department shall adopt by rule standards for the
- 47 operation of vehicles used to provide non-ambulatory NEMT
- 48 transportation services that are reasonably necessary to protect
- 49 the health and safety of individuals using that service.
- 50 (4) Standards adopted under this section must include, but
- 51 are not limited to:
- 52 (a) Qualifications of drivers and attendants, including
- 53 driver training requirements that must be met before a driver
- 54 provides non-ambulatory special transportation, including, but not
- 55 limited to:
- (i) Fingerprint background check;
- 57 (ii) Annual criminal background checks, including
- 58 sex offender registry;
- 59 (iii) Annual motor vehicle records (MVR) checks
- 60 from the Department of Public Safety;
- 61 (iv) Drug screens;
- 62 (v) Regular confirmation that the driver does not
- 63 appear on the Office of Inspector General (OIG) exclusion lists;
- 64 (vi) For drivers, appropriate training for the
- 65 mode of transportation being provided;
- (b) Safety of vehicles and necessary safety equipment;
- 67 (c) General requirements concerning inspection and
- 68 maintenance of vehicles, replacement vehicles, standard vehicle

- 69 equipment, and specialized equipment necessary to ensure vehicle
- 70 usability and safety for disabled persons; and
- 71 (d) Minimum insurance requirements.
- 72 (5) * * * An NEMT provider must meet all the requirements
- 73 and standards set by the department * * * if providing
- 74 non-ambulatory NEMT transportation services. NEMT providers are
- 75 required to have on hand at a location in the state and be able to
- 76 produce upon request the necessary documentation to prove
- 77 compliance with the requirements and standards set by the
- 78 department as provided in this section.
- 79 (6) The department is authorized to revoke the permit of, or
- 80 impose fines on, any NEMT provider that is found to be not in
- 81 compliance with the requirements and standards set by the
- 82 department for providing non-ambulatory NEMT transportation
- 83 services.
- 84 (7) The department is authorized to bring actions for
- 85 injunctions in the name of the department to enjoin and prohibit
- 86 any person or entity from providing non-ambulatory NEMT
- 87 transportation services in the state without having a current,
- 88 valid permit from the department except as otherwise provided in
- 89 this section.
- 90 (8) An NEMT provider that is a Medicaid provider under
- 91 contract with an NEMT transportation broker providing
- 92 non-ambulatory NEMT services for the Division of Medicaid shall
- 93 not be required to have a permit from the department to provide

94	NEMT transportation services ii: (a) the broker periodically
95	inspects the transport drivers for the NEMT provider and the
96	vehicles used by the transport drivers for compliance with the
97	standards prescribed in subsection (4) of this section and any
98	additional standards adopted by the department under subsection
99	(3) of this section \star \star \star ; and (b) the NEMT broker determines that
100	the drivers and vehicles are in compliance with those standards
101	and certifies such compliance with the department. The department
102	shall not make its own inspection of any drivers and vehicles that
103	have been certified by an NEMT broker as provided in this
104	subsection. Any NEMT provider that is exempt from the permitting
105	requirement under this subsection shall be required to register
106	with the department.

- 107 (9) * * * Ambulatory NEMT services for individuals who need

 108 minimal assistance but cannot drive themselves do not require

 109 special permitting by the department.
- 110 This section does not preclude an NEMT provider from 111 using a permitted vehicle to provide services to ambulatory 112 individuals, nor does it exclude the use of a Transportation Network Company licensed under Section 77-8-5 or a contract 113 114 carrier by motor vehicle permitted under Section 77-7-49 from 115 being utilized by a public or private entity, including Medicaid, 116 for purposes of providing nonemergency medical transportation to 117 ambulatory individuals.

118 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 119 and after July 1, 2025.
