HOUSE BILL NO. 666

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE CURRICULUM AND IMPLEMENT COURSES IN AFRICAN-AMERICAN STUDIES AND RACIAL DIVERSITY TO BE INCLUDED IN THE PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION CURRICULUM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** In addition to the curriculum otherwise required
- 7 by law or the State Board of Education to be taught in the public
- 8 schools of this state, the board shall develop a comprehensive
- 9 curriculum and implement courses in African-American Studies and
- 10 Racial Diversity for all students in Grade 9 through Grade 12. In
- 11 addition to meeting the competencies and objectives established by
- 12 the State Board of Education in the Mississippi Social Studies
- 13 Framework, the African-American Studies and Racial Diversity
- 14 course must:
- 15 (a) Provide students with an examination of the
- 16 contributions of people of African descent to American History and
- 17 emphasis on the importance of diversity in American culture;
- 18 (b) Provide a chronological framework of African and
- 19 African-American history;

20	(c) Broaden the knowledge and understandings of
21	students interested in learning about the histories, cultures and
22	economic, geographic and political realities of African Americans;
23	(d) Provide students with an opportunity to engage with
24	the social, economic and political activities of African
25	Americans;
26	(e) Consist of historical content taught with relevance
27	to contemporary and current issues in order to ensure a deeper
28	understanding of cultural issues of the nineteenth and twentieth
29	centuries which have impacted the diverse ethnic and racial
30	populations of the state and nation;
31	(f) Infuse African-American Studies and Racial
32	Diversity as an integral part of American History, including:
33	(i) Slavery;
34	(ii) Post slavery;
35	(iii) The Civil Rights Movement and its
36	contributions;
37	(iv) Reconstruction;
38	(v) Harlem Renaissance;
39	(vi) World Wars I and II; and
40	(vii) Other national and global events.
41	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
42	and after July 1, 2025.
