HOUSE BILL NO. 676

AN ACT RELATING TO CERTIFIED COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CLINICS (CCBHC); TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH AND THE DIVISION OF MEDICAID TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE FEDERAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ADMINISTRATION 5 (SAMSHA) TO JOIN THE MEDICAID CCBHC DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM AT THE 6 NEXT AVAILABLE APPLICATION PERIOD; TO PROVIDE THAT THE DIVISION OF 7 MEDICAID, IN COLLABORATION WITH STATE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH, SHALL SUBMIT A STATE PLAN AMENDMENT TO CMS FOR THE PURPOSE OF 8 9 IMPLEMENTING THE CCBHC MODEL AS A PILOT PROGRAM IN COMMUNITY 10 MENTAL HEALTH REGIONS 6 AND 9 AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER THE 11 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CCBHC SYSTEM IN 12 THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE DEMONSTRATION 13 PROGRAM ESTABLISHED BY FEDERAL LAWS GOVERNING THE CCBHC MODEL; TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH SHALL BE THE 14 15 ENTITY CHARGED WITH CERTIFYING AND MONITORING COMPLIANCE OF CCBHC 16 CLINICS, AND THE DIVISION OF MEDICAID SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR 17 ESTABLISHING A PROSPECTIVE PAYMENT SYSTEM TO FUND THE CCBHC 18 PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 20 **SECTION 1.** (1) The purpose of this section is to improve 21 quality, access, and innovation in the provision of mental health 22 and substance use services to individuals treated at community 23 mental health centers, operated by regional commissions as 24 provided in Section 41-19-33, through enhanced certification of 25 community mental health centers as a Certified Community 26 Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC). - 27 comprehensive, holistic services, respond to local needs,
- 28 incorporate evidence-based practices, and establish care
- 29 coordination as a lynchpin for service delivery including
- 30 effective community partnerships with law enforcement, schools,

- 32 organizations to improve care, reduce recidivism, and address
- 33 health disparities.
- 34 (2) The State Department of Mental Health and the Division
- 35 of Medicaid shall submit an application to the federal Substance
- 36 Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) to join
- 37 the Medicaid Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC)
- 38 Demonstration Program established by Section 223 of the Protecting
- 39 Access to Medicare Act (PAMA) of 2014 at the next available
- 40 application period.
- 41 (3) The Division of Medicaid, in collaboration with State
- 42 Department of Mental Health, shall submit a State Plan Amendment
- 43 to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for the
- 44 purpose of implementing the CCBHC model as a pilot program in
- 45 community mental health Regions 6 and 9 as soon as possible after
- 46 the effective date of this section. The community mental health
- 47 centers in Regions 6 and 9 shall have the opportunity to apply for
- 48 CCBHC certification by July 1, 2026.
- 49 (4) The CCBHC system in the pilot program provided under
- 50 this section shall be consistent with the Demonstration Program
- 51 established by Section 223 of the PAMA and other applicable

52	federal	laws	governing	the	CCBHC	model.	The	State	Department	of

- 53 Mental Health shall be the entity charged with certifying and
- 54 monitoring compliance of CCBHC clinics, and the Division of
- 55 Medicaid shall be responsible for establishing a
- 56 prospective payment system (PPS) to fund the CCBHC program.
- 57 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 58 and after its passage.
